### Slightly Used Music Wrap-up

Thank you to those of you who contributed to the successful "Used Music Sale". There were many treasures at bargain prices. The twenty-four that attended had lots of fun sifting through many boxes of used music the day of the January workshop in Carlisle. The leftover "used" music has been donated to the Lebanon Valley College Music Department for their lending library.

The majority of organists began their pursuit of music by studying the piano, as a child. Most organists work to achieve a minimal level of proficiency at the piano before they begin their study of the organ. We all know the basic differences and similarities between organ and piano technique. On Tuesday, February 19, our AGO meeting will go beyond these basics and focus in-depth at organ and piano technique. Dr. Dennis Sweigart, piano professor at Lebanon Valley College, and Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman, organ and piano professor and Dean of our college will lead our discussion. We will begin by taking a brief look at the historical development of technique. A power point presentation will help guide the listener through the changes in organ and piano design. We will note the influence that each instrument has played on the other in regard to the development of technique. Several pieces will be performed by both clinicians. We will hear and see how the same piece sounds on the piano and the organ. Both performers will discuss how changes in their technique affected the musical result of the piece. Finally, we will discuss ways to improve your piano and organ technique. There will be a time for questions and answers as well. After the workshop, feel free to try out the wonderful Gabriel Kney tracker organ! The workshop is free and open to the public. This will be a workshop geared for all levels of organists. The workshop will also be helpful to pianists interested in studying organ and piano teachers that might have students studying both instruments. Come prepared to learn techniques that will help you to become a better pianist and organist.

Directions to LVC: Take 422 to Annville. At the intersection of 422 and 934, turn left. Go north on Hwy 934 about 1/2 mile. Turn right at the main entrance of the college. You will pass Miller Chapel on your right (big cross on top). Turn right at the stop sign. The Music school is on your right. The workshop will be in Blair Music Building in the Organ/Choral room. If you would like to carpool to the event, be sure to call Shawn Gingrich.

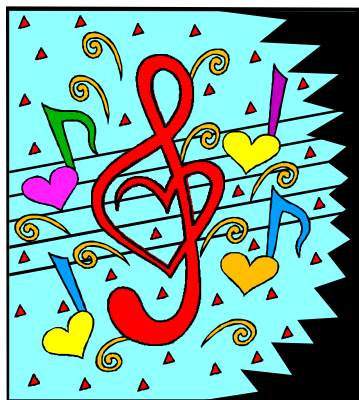
