On Saturday, March 16 at 10:00AM we will gather at Zion Lutheran Church in Enola to "Meet the Allen Renaissance R450." Scott Clark from the Allen Company will be present to demonstrate the instrument's capabilities and show us how voices can be swapped and customized using a laptop computer. Following the demonstration there will be an open console time during which attending guild members may play this magnificent four manual instrument. Please plan to attend.

Directions to Zion Lutheran Church 265 North Enola Drive, Enola PA:

From Harrisburg and points East:

1. Get on Interstate 81 South. Get off Exit 21, Enola.
2. At end of ramp, turn right. Drive approximately 1.1 mile (passing Wendy's, Summerdale Plaza and Eat n' Park on your right.)
3. At Barlup's Appliances, turn right. Drive about two blocks, approx. 3/10 of a mile, to stop sign. Turn left onto North Enola Drive. Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church is on your right.

From Mechanicsburg and points West:

1. Get on Route 11&15 North. Follow the signs to 81 North.
2. At the split for Harrisburg or 11&15 North bear right. Go 1 mile till "T". Turn left.
3. Go 3.2 miles. At Barlup's Appliances, turn left. Drive about two blocks, approximately 3/10 of a mile, to stop sign. Turn left onto North Enola Drive. Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church is on your right.
