Mid-Year Memberships

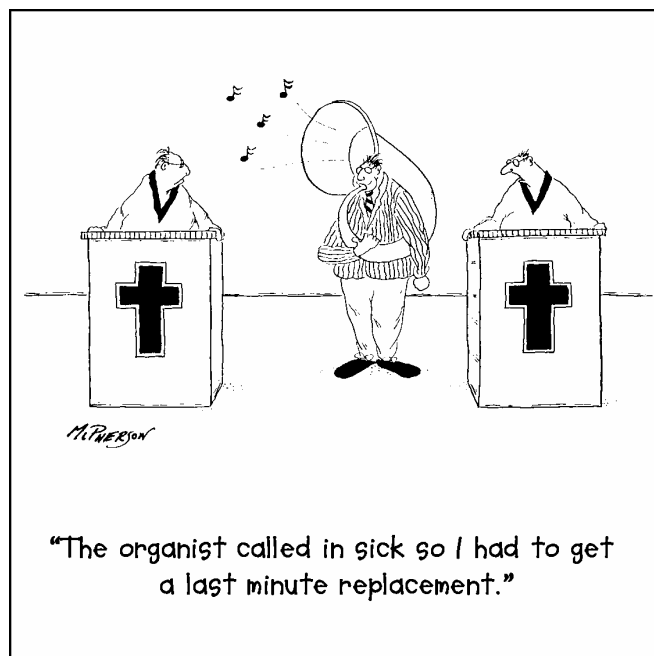

Getting to Know...

...Doris Parsels

Would you believe that this organist owns 80 cats?? She does!! Not alive, of course, but she does have a collection of cats, ceramic and otherwise numbering in that area. She also enjoys flower gardening and indoor plants as well as cross-stitching, but finds it difficult to find much time to pursue those activities. Along with her duties as Minister of Music at Prince of Peace Episcopal Church in Gettysburg, she and her husband have traveled extensively in Canada and the US, from Key West, the southern-most point of the US to Point Barrow, Alaska, the northern-most point, to Cape Spear, Newfoundland, the eastern-most point of North America. Oh, and a singing tour to Germany and Austria with a local church choir as well! Doris says that some of her most exciting and memorable experiences have been seeing awesome Mount McKinley in Alaska and the wildlife they have viewed, including grizzly bears, polar bears, moose, mountain goats, bighorn sheep, whales, and some close and personal, such as the bear she met face to face on a trail near Juneau, Alaska.



But let me start at the beginning. Doris was born in York County, PA near Red Lion. She graduated *magna cum laude* from Nyack College, Nyack, NY, with a Bachelor of Sacred Music degree, with a major in organ and a minor in voice. After graduation, she was employed on the college staff for a year and took some further classes. She married her husband, Roger, a native of Ithaca, NY, and moved to Lansford, PA, where her husband was employed as a music teacher and band director. While there she served for five years as organist (and Roger as choir director) at English Congregational Church, a congregation with a strong Welsh background. They then moved to Gettysburg, where Roger accepted a position as high school band director. Together they served for ten years as organist and choir director at St. Paul United Church of Christ in New Oxford, near Gettysburg. Since 1976, they have served at historic Prince of Peace Episcopal Church in Gettysburg (under five rectors and four interim rectors!) During her early years in Gettysburg, Doris had the privilege of substituting at the Gettysburg Presbyterian Church where President and Mrs. Eisenhower were attending. Her church music positions

While living in Lansford, Doris studied organ with Ludwig Lenel in Allentown, and with Frank Eldridge at Ithaca College while her husband did graduate work. After moving to Gettysburg, she studied with Dexter Weikel, and presently studies with Steven Cooksey at Shenandoah University, Winchester, VA. She sees herself as a life-long learner, having taken classes at Westminster Choir College (handbells, organ), Shippensburg University (music education), Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg (church music), and Shenandoah Conservatory (church music). She is interested in handbells and participates in ringing with church groups.

Doris and Roger have one married daughter and two granddaughters, who live in upstate New York, where their daughter teaches private lessons in piano and instruments. And then there are the cats

Rather than choosing to become a church organist, Doris feels that she was chosen. Because she skipped fourth grade, she graduated high school at age 16 and worked for several years as a secretary in a furniture manufacturing facility. During that time, circumstances in her life led her to enroll in college in church music studies, and the rest was history.

Her words of wisdom for those considering or just entering the field of church music would be:

“Remember it is a divine calling and you must be “wise as serpents and harmless as doves” as you serve under those in authority. You will probably be underpaid and considered dispensable.

“Teaching Beginning Organ to Children and Adults”

-- by Wayne Leupold

This workshop for organists assists them (1) in recognizing the potential of teaching children and adults from the very beginning of their musical experience at the organ, and (2) by presenting recruitment ideas, teaching advice, and teaching materials that will enable organ teachers to achieve this potential.

The content of this workshop would include the following:

- 1) an explanation of the pedagogical philosophy that is the basis of this method, including the methods approach to
 - (a) teaching music reading,
 - (b) developing musicianship, and
 - (c) establishing a solid keyboard technique;
- 2) a survey of all the materials currently available;
- 3) advice for all the levels regarding use of the various series especially with young children, as well as with adult beginners; and
- 4) both general and specific advice concerning how to use the materials with beginning students having had no previous keyboard training and with student pianists who would come to these materials with various levels of keyboard proficiency.

Do plan to attend the February 10th workshop at Faith Presbyterian Church and consider inviting and bringing along a colleague who might be interested in joining our chapter. Mr. Leupold's workshop promises to provide a wide range of information and suggestions related to learning and teaching music that will be useful for us all!

Organ Study at the University of Notre Dame

Greetings,

Do you know of a student or colleague who might be interested in our MSM degree at the University of Notre Dame?

At the moment I am recruiting students for our Master of Sacred Music program at the University of Notre Dame. This program is in its third year, and it is a wonderful program that has already attracted fine students. We are extremely excited about what is going on here. The degree combines music (two organ recitals, organ literature, music history) and liturgy courses. There are details of the program on the website: <http://www.nd.edu/~msm/>

The assistantships pay full tuition for two years plus a stipend of \$12,000 per year for two years. If you know of any prospective undergraduate students or others who are not currently enrolled in a graduate program, I would appreciate hearing from you. If you have any names to suggest, I am happy to contact them. It is not too late to apply for 2008-2009.

Typically a student on an assistantship works in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart on campus. The Sunday morning mass has been broadcast across the country every Sunday on the Hallmark Channel for the last five years; the average viewership was around 1.5 million per week. This broadcast will change soon to another network. There is so much musical work to be done there that it is a great hands-on learning experience.

Our new Fritts organ and organ hall are stunning. We have an eclectic-style tracker organ in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart that is also used for teaching, practice, and performance. You can see the Fritts at <http://www.frittsorgan.com/opus024.htm>

Newly Renovated and Enlarged Organ for Second Presbyterian Church, Carlisle

The congregation of Second Presbyterian Church, Carlisle, PA is pleased to announce that renovations to its sanctuary organ are nearing completion. The original Moller Pipe organ was built by M. P. Moller, Inc. of Hagerstown, Maryland for Second Presbyterian's downtown Carlisle location on Hanover Street and dedicated on November 20, 1950. In 1971, the organ was moved to a new sanctuary and redesigned for its home on Garland Drive. Many elements of the older instrument remained and new tonal elements were added. In 1985, a new console was designed by Cannarsa of Duncansville, PA to fit into the décor of the sanctuary. At the request of Andy Hoke (Director of Music, appointed in 2002) and an organ study committee, research on possible improvements began in 2002, was formalized and approved by the session and congregation in 2006, and refurbishment began in 2007. Companies chosen for the work were Buch Church Organ Company of Ephrata, PA, SDG Organ Company of Millersville, PA, and Walker Technical Company of Zionsville, PA with Buch organ as the project leader. SDG did the work on the 39 ranks of pipes (2293 in all) including rewiring, releathering, revoicing, rescaling, retuning, and replacement of many old parts as needed. Temporary repairs were replaced by permanent repairs. Buch and Walker Technical Company built the new console and added digital stops and new features. A Rodgers MX – 200 sound module including 1122 total sounds was also purchased to increase the expressive potential of the instrument. The new specification is listed below with digital stop additions marked with an asterisk.

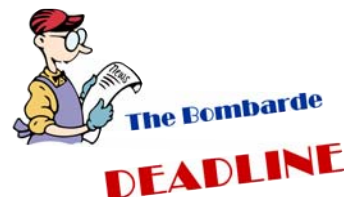
