**Harrisburg Chapter AGO will host a POE+ at
Messiah College, Grantham, PA
July 10-14, 2016**

What is POE+?

- A Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) is an educational outreach program of the American Guild of Organists.
- A 4-5 day event organized by a local AGO chapter under the sponsorship of the national organization.
- A national program sponsored by the American Guild of Organists. Students are admitted to POE+ on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of attendance at prior POEs, and regardless of state or country of residence, as long as they meet the following eligibility guidelines: Students should be 19 or older, want to play the organ or currently play the organ in a church or synagogue, and be interested in improving their organ skills.
- An event open to organists ranging from beginners (proficient pianists who will learn the basics of organ playing) to advanced.
- An event offering instruction in basic technique, pedaling, improvisation and registration for beginners, and skills such as hymn playing, sight reading and transposition (which may lead to qualifying as a candidate for the AGO Service Playing Certificate) for more experienced students. Other topics include a general overview of organ literature, history, and pipe organ construction and design.
- An opportunity for participation in ecumenical worship, so as to experience the role of the sacred musician.
- Most of all, provides a unique opportunity for participants to meet and interact with peers who have similar interests.

Arts Fest in 2016

ArtsFEST draws huge crowds over Memorial Day Weekend to Harrisburg. The festival has lots of superb arts and crafts, all located along Front St. St Stephen's Cathedral is not only on Front Street, it is in the very center of the festival.

As I have done for the past two years, I play a 15 minute recital every hour on the hour all day long, on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. To draw crowds, we pealed the great cathedral bell prior to each recital (and, of course, had all the doors wide open). Many folks came in and we heard again and again that they had not heard such music previously or, had heard it, but not for some years.

Next year, I would like to expand this program by welcoming fellow AGO members to play on this event. I'd suggest that each person play a 30 to 50 minute recital. Participants would be encouraged to bring materials with them which detailed musical events at their home churches & schools. Said materials would be put out for the entire weekend in the church narthex. Dates and times are May 28, 11 to 5, May 29, Noon to 5, and May 30, 10 to 5.

Players would be encouraged to emphasize music that would appeal to organ novices. For example, I played Bach Toccata and Fugue in d or the St Anne Fugue and they were more enthusiastically received than Schmucke dich. Pieces like Ore's *What a Friend We Have in Jesus* and the Widor Toccata also went over quite well.
