

# HARRISBURG CHAPTER AMERICAN GUILD OF ORGANISTS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Minutes, Tuesday, May 1, 2007 Trinity Lutheran Church-Camp Hill

Absent: Lou Ann Potter. Robert Carbaugh attended as a guest.

The minutes of the January 9, 2007, meeting we approved on a motion by Josephine Freund and a second by Mary Jane Nelson.

Dean Ellen Hunt read a letter from the AGO National Office thanking us for the \$200 we sent for the Annual Fund. Joseph Gribb sent a letter of thanks to our Chapter for sending him to the POE last summer. The Dean announced the resignation of Richard Frey from the Board and announced that Suzanne Klinedinst will finish the term of office for Richard Frey. The acceptance of the resignation and the appointment of Suzanne were on a motion by Fran Treisbach and a second by Mary Jane Nelson.

Treasurer Brian Rice distributed financial reports for the period of January 9, 2007 through May 1, 2007. These reports were approved on a motion by Josephine Freund and second by Doris Savage. # Meet Andy Hoke

Although I may have met Andy Hoke at Chapter functions in the past, I had not seen him in action until he was one of the three presenters at our February 24th Choral Workshop. He gave an interesting presentation on vocal selections for seasons throughout the church year appropriate for adult choirs. The workshop was held at the Second Presbyterian Church, Carlisle, where Andy has been fulltime Director of Music since 2002, leading or administering nine ensembles including vocal choirs and bell choirs. He plays the organ and piano for weekly services and also serves as director of the church's arts series. Andy especially enjoys directing his 55voice Sanctuary Choir, but he also delights in the handbells and other adult and youth vocal groups. He also enjoys composing or arranging special music tailored to the specific needs of the ensembles.

He relates that Second Presbyterian is in the middle of a major renovation to the church's 33-rank Moller organ. The Soli Deo Gloria Organ Company of Millersville is handling the pipe work and revoicing, and the Buch Organ Company of Ephrata is adding some Walker digital stops and a new console. Andy states that this renovation is scheduled to be completed between Thanksgiving and Christmas of this year, and, he adds, "Fortunately, I also enjoy playing the piano!"

In addition to his inside-the-church activities, he volunteers for service activities such as mission projects and trips and Habitat for Humanity, serving as an overnight volunteer for Carlisle CARES (the local churches' coordinated homeless shelter), serving as pianist for the local Rotary Club, and doing concerts and benefits with other local church groups on behalf of Project SHARE (the Carlisle Food Bank). Andy says that, since his Associate Pastor is also the president of the Clean Air Board, there are many local opportunities to be involved with environmental concerns.

Musically, in addition to being a member of Harrisburg AGO, he is a life member of the American Choral Directors Association and a member of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians. He always looks forward to PAM's Conference on Music and Worship each year at Montreat in North Carolina's Smoky Mountains.

In addition to conducting choral groups, Andy has an excellent bass-baritone voice and has sung with the Susquehanna Chorale over the past twenty years, beginning in high school and only taking a break during his four years at Westminster Choir College. During the last four or five years, he has served as bass section leader in the Chorale.

While in college, he was privileged to sing with the world-renowned Westminster Choir under Dr. Joseph Flummerfelt. The choir served as the opera chorus for the Festival of Two Worlds in Spoleto, Italy, and Charleston, South Carolina. He was also part of the college's Symphonic Choir which performed regularly under noted conductors for performance of major choral works each year in Philadelphia and New York.

At Westminster he earned a degree in Music Theory and Composition, and in 1994 he obtained Pennsylvania Teacher's Certification from Lebanon Valley College. Following that, he taught in public schools in southern Vermont and in Palmyra. While in Palmyra, he worked as a part-time church musician at Grace United Methodist Church in Hummelstown.

In 1998 Andy married Christina Hinderliter, "my love and my best friend," in his words. Their three children, Simon, 8, India, 6, and Philip, 4, are all enthusiastic students at the Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet.

In addition to his family and his service activities, some of his other interests include film (especially the Midtown Cinema

in Harrisburg and the Carlisle Theatre). as well as all levels and types of sports, particularly Carlisle, Penn State and Baltimore Ravens football. enjovs Andy reading news and periodicals and refers



to himself as a "news and maps junkie" with maps from all over the world decorating his church office. He also enjoys hiking, especially on the nearby Appalachian Trail.

Hike all you like, Andy, but be sure to come back! We cherish talents such as yours in our membership and hope you are with our Chapter for many more years.

#### **Pipes in Proximity** The Jardine Organ Nicarry Meetinghouse of the Brethren Community, New Oxford, PA

George Jardine began building organs in New York City around 1832. In 1855 the addition of "& Son" was made to name plates. The firm continued building organs until 1900. The Jardine organ presented in this article was built for the Congregational Church in South Britain, Connecticut in 1869. It originally had three ranks of pipes. It was relocated to the University of Washington in Seattle, Washington, and then made its way to York Hospital Chapel in York, Pennsylvania in 1983 when it was rebuilt and enlarged by Brunner & Heller. Then in 1996 it was donated to The Brethren Home Community in New Oxford, Pennsylvania. In 2000 the Jardine organ found its current home in the Nicarry Meetinghouse of the Brethren Community.

Each year chapter member Shirley King arranges and participates in the Jardine Organ Concert Series at The Brethren Community. Concerts this year are: September 23, 2007 – Shawn Gingrich, organist; December 16, 2007 – Lori Elliot, flutist with Shirley King, organist; and April 13, 2008 – TBA. Each concert is held at 2:00pm in the Nicarry Meetinghouse.
