Music Scholarship Opportunity Offered

The Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) is a four to five-day event held in various parts of the country for young pianists who wish to explore the organ. Mystery Member Biography

"Traveling and playing the organ are two of my favorite activities. When Mary Jane first asked me to provide information for a mini bio, I had to decline because I was leaving for Kenya the next day. I very much enjoyed my tripseeing lots of birds and animals, attempting to climb Mt. Kenya, hearing fantastic music in a small Catholic church in Naro Muro, and playing a very nice organ at All Saints Episcopal in Nairobi.

"I am planning to go around the world next spring, starting off with playing for a wedding in Australia - then on to Croatia, Italy and Ireland - with who-knows-what stops along the way. I have had great success with email, snail mail, and simply walking in off the street in getting to play organs both domestically and internationally. I highly recommend the practice!

"As for my music background, I started piano at age five, played the accordion in junior high, and began organ lessons in high school. My first paying job was chapel organist for various denominations at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio at \$6 per service – what a deal! – but it provided great experience. As a non-music major, I took lessons through the Extension Department at the University of Colorado where I graduated in 1971, studying with various graduate students.

"This month, I will be starting my 19th year as Organist at Christ Church UCC in Elizabethtown. I served numerous denominations in Colorado, Texas and Massachusetts prior to this position. My "day job" until I retired in May, was in data management at Tyco Electronics. I am now enjoying leisurely morning coffee, more practice time, kayaking, yoga, and time to read. That job really did get in the way! I am an avid cook and enjoy time in my kitchen, which is lined with 100-year-old oak, recycled from Christ Church's remodeling a few years ago.

"As a church musician, I thoroughly enjoy exploring all types of music for both organ and piano. I feel that limiting myself to traditional classical music is a disservice to both myself and my congregation. Variety really is the spice of life. So, my shelves of music at church are very much like my spice rack at home. It holds 100 bottles."

February Program at Faith Presbyterian Church

February 10th seems far off, but it will be here before we know it! Organist and music publisher Wayne Leupold will be presenting our next AGO program, which will be a workshop on February 10th for the Harrisburg Chapter from 2:00-5:15 PM at Faith Presbyterian Church (1801 Colonial Road, Harrisburg).

"Teaching Beginning Organ to Children and Adults" -- by Wayne Leupold

This workshop for organists assists them (1) in recognizing the potential of teaching children and adults from the very beginning of their musical experience at the organ, and (2) by presenting recruitment ideas, teaching advice, and teaching materials that will enable organ teachers to achieve this potential.

The content of this workshop would include the following:

- 1) an explanation of the pedagogical philosophy that is the basis of this method, including the methods approach to
 - (a) teaching music reading,
 - (b) developing musicianship, and
 - (c) establishing a solid keyboard technique;
- 2) a survey of all the materials currently available;
- 3) advice for all the levels regarding use of the various series especially with young children, as well as with adult beginners; and
- 4) both general and specific advice concerning how to use the materials with beginning students having had no previous keyboard training and with student pianists who would come to these materials with various levels of keyboard proficiency.

I hope you will plan to attend the February 10th workshop at Faith Presbyterian Church and consider inviting and bringing along a colleague who might be interested in joining our chapter. Mr. Leupold's workshop promises to provide a wide range of information and suggestions related to learning and teaching music that will be useful for us all!


