



When You Need a Substitute (revisited from 8/2005)

Compiled, edited and collaborated by AGO substitutes

The person making the call, i.e., church musician, secretary or other representative of the church, should identify the name of the church, location and number of services (with or without communion) and time of service(s), and fee to be paid. An emergency telephone number should be given to the susbstitute to use in case of illness, snow emergency, etc. The person making the call should be able to give the name of the organ and whether it is pipe or electronic and how many manuals and ranks.

Also mentioned should be the church office hours for establishing practice time. Is the organ available for practice on a Saturday?

Because of the demands for a substitute, quite often he/she may play at a different church of various denominations each week. **Respect for the substitute by the church musician should be a consideration in the planning for the worship service**. Will the choir sing an anthem or will the choir just be asked to support the organist in leading the worship in song? Please think carefully before adding any other groups to the music, i.e., soloists, bell choirs, children's choirs, etc.

Hymn numbers and liturgical setting, if applicable, should be given at the time of the phone call or email, or **no later than one week in advance** in a separate mailing.

Will organist direct the choir? If so, give time of pre-service rehearsal and location. Provide anthem no later than one week in advance. Will there be a soloist? If so, soloist needs to contact the substitute and arrange a time to practice.

Indicate what day bulletin is printed and whether titles of prelude/offertory/postlude are to be included in the bulletin. Will prelude be played before service starts or after announcements are given and how long should the prelude be in length? **Arrange for a bulletin to be on the organ prior to the service.**

If changes are made, it is important that the substitute is notified ASAP (surprises can sometimes be a problem for the organist and subsequently the church). Even if someone other than the church musician makes the contact, the church musician **MUST** also let the substitute know details related to playing the service (any uniqueness, etc.)

Courtesies when arriving to practice:

- Take him/her to the organ; show where key is kept or where switch is to turn on
- OR: make certain organ is unlocked; if locked, leave instructions where to find key
- Turn on lights/offer to turn on heat/AC
- Tell location of restroom
- Offer to give a key for practice during off office hours
- Give location of choir room, if applicable

Payment is expected prior to the time of the service. If playing for a longer period of time (consecutive weeks), an agreement regarding payment must be arranged between the substitute and the church.

P.S. Cut out or copy and tape this to the organ and give a copy to the church secretary!
