Introducing Eric Riley

On November 1, 2007, Eric Riley began his duties as Director of Music and Organist at Market Square Presbyterian Church in downtown Harrisburg, following seventeen years in northeastern Ohio. He was director of music/organist at First United Methodist Church in Cleveland for fourteen years, and held a similar position at Calvary Presbyterian Church in Canton for three years. While at this church, he hosted a community-based after-school music program for children. Riley was also Associate Artistic Director for **Voices of Canton** and accompanist for the Canton Symphony Orchestra Chorus, as well as organist/harpsichordist for the symphony.

He has been a church musician at Welbourne United Methodist Church in Richmond, VA and in Central New York State at St. James' Episcopal Church, Skaneateles, a professional tenor at Temple Adath Yeshrun, and pipe organ builder for Kerner and Merchant, both located in Syracuse.

Born in Chester, PA, Riley grew up in Schenectady, NY. His Bachelor of Music degree in organ performance is from Syracuse University where he studied with Will O. Headlee. He earned his Master of Church Music degree from Scaritt Graduate School at Vanderbilt University, in Nashville, TN, studying organ with Wilma Jensen and conducting with Sandra Willetts. Other organ teachers include Karel Paukert, Robert Parkins and Don Ingram.

Riley has been winner of the Poister Prize in organ from Syracuse University, First Prize winner of the Arthur Poister Memorial Scholarship Competition in Syracuse, Second Prize winner of the Flint International Organ Competition, and a finalist in the Fort Wayne National Competition, the Naples International Competition and the Battipaglia (Italy) International Organ Competition.



Eric began traveling and performing in Europe in 2001 and has performed for the Assisi Music Festival, the Spoleto Festival of Two Worlds, the International Festival of Choral Singing in Castellione del Lago, the Gubbio International Music Festival and CoroFest Umbria, all in Italy. This June he will make his fifth performance trip to Italy, playing solo organ concerts in Assisi, Bologna and Florence, as well as accompanying choral concerts and playing chamber music around the regions of Tuscany and Umbria. He will perform a "preview" concert of his program for Italy, on June 6, at 7:30 pm, in the sanctuary at Market Square Church. A reception will follow the free concert.

Eric is married to mezzo-soprano, Christine, with whom he owns a house in Hummelstown. Three cats and a dog complete the residents of their home. Their daughter, Debra, lives with her husband and two young daughters in suburban New York City. Eric is an avid golfer, having spent three years as a teaching professional in Ohio. Chris and Eric also enjoy tennis, gardening and travel.

On June 6, everyone of us has a chance to hear a tour-worthy performance from Eric, and we can get to know him better, enjoying his talents at the same time. Welcome, Eric, to our Chapter! We wish you well on your tour in Italy and a safe return to Harrisburg.

Have You Seen These?

Chuck Yocum

Since I'm back in the saddle, so to speak, I decided to buy some new organ music. I thought you may want to know about a few of the new purchases, so I sat down at the organ console this afternoon to get an idea or two about what I bought.

The first book I will review for you is **Reformation Suite** by James Pethel, (The Sacred Music Press 70/1607S). It is interesting to me because the four pieces are listed as Level 3, but not terribly difficult. These are all based on hymn tunes that everyone knows.

The first is **My Hope is Built on Nothing Less** (SOLID ROCK) timed at 2:45 and registered for three manuals and pedal, but can be done on two manuals with the aid of a few pistons. It is marked light and bright, and has a key change for 16 measures (marked slightly slower; smoothly) then back to the original key to finish. This is a delightful setting of this hymn tune and deserves to be played and heard.

The second is **In Christ There Is No East or West** (MCKEE) also timed at 2:45 and registered for three manuals, but adaptable to two. It begins in the key of C and stays that way for 35 measures (2 pages), changes to the key of D and is just 11 measures in duration, and then back to C. Minimal pedaling required here.

There's a Wideness in God's Mercy (WELLESLEY) is our third piece and is registered for two manuals and pedal with a duration of 2:30. Pedaling is very minimal and starts in B-flat and ends in G. This will require little practice and will be a good one for your repetoire.

Our final piece is **A Mighty Fortress Is Our God** (EIN' FESTE BURG) which should be known to all. It would make a fine festival prelude for Reformation Sunday or possibly the postlude. Again, this piece is registered for two manuals and pedal and the duration is 3:30. Would you believe it's in the key of C and stays there for the full 5 pages?

The cost for this gem is \$15.00 and will do you proud - maybe even get you some praise and a raise, which we all need now and then!

CODE OF ETHICS - Revised by the National Council on April 16, 2007		
Preamble: The purpose of the American Guild of Organists is to promote the organ in its historic and evolving roles, to encourage excellence in the provide a forum for mutual support, inspiration, education, and certification of Guild members. Voting members are entitled to enjoy the privileges and are expected to accept the responsibilities of membership in the Guild. Members shall be considered equally for Groffices and participation in Guild activities. These are the rules that shall be considered binding upon all voting members in good standing.		
RULE 1. Members shall promote good working relationships within the American Guild of Organists and shall respect the employment of colleaguembers shall address differences between themselves and other members by following the procedures outlined in the <i>Discipline</i> .		
RULE 2. Members shall not seek or appear to be seeking employment for themselves, a student, or a colleague, in a position held by someone else. Mobers shall apply for employment only for a position which the employer, with the knowledge of the incumbent musician, has officially and publicly declarated vacant by announcement of the vacancy.		
RULE 3. In cases pending under the <i>Procedures</i> or in cases where the National Council has determined that a position has been made vacant by wrong termination of a member of the American Guild of Organists, members shall not seek or accept regular or permanent employment for themselves, a stud or colleague at that Institution until the National Council is satisfied that differences between the Guild and the Institution have been resolved. Interim vices may be provided for a period of 90 days.		
RULE 4. Before accepting an engagement for a wedding, funeral, or other service, members shall obtain the approval of the incumbent musician. In case where this engagement has been requested by a third party, it is appropriate for the third party to offer the incumbent his/her customary fee. It is the respisibility of members to inform the third party of this rule.
