Please look carefully through all this year's program opportunities. There is something for everyone on this year's docket. There is a good mix of events for organ and choral people.

Many of you have choirs like mine – a dozen or so singers, badly balanced with three or four sopranos, four or five altos, and a few basses and tenors. Choosing music that is liturgically, musically, and intellectually satisfying for such a group is difficult to say the least. I have found that St. James Music Press, online at <http://www.sjmp.com>, has several collections of two and three-part anthems that fill the bill quite nicely for any small group. The accompaniments require ample keyboard technique, but the voice parts are rather easy without being boring. They also come with permission to photocopy. You might want to take a look, especially if you are still in the process of finalizing your choral plans for this new choir season.

Have a fruitful and creative year of music making.

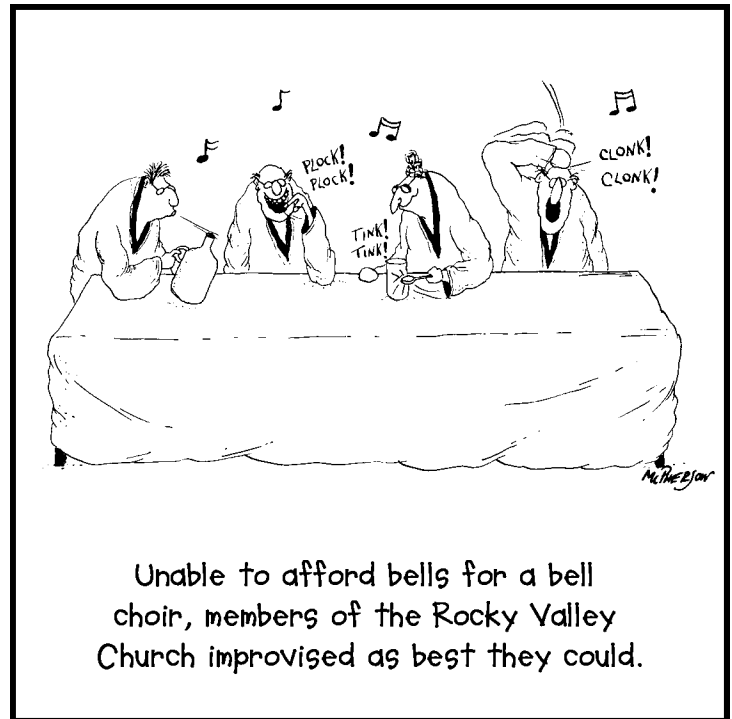

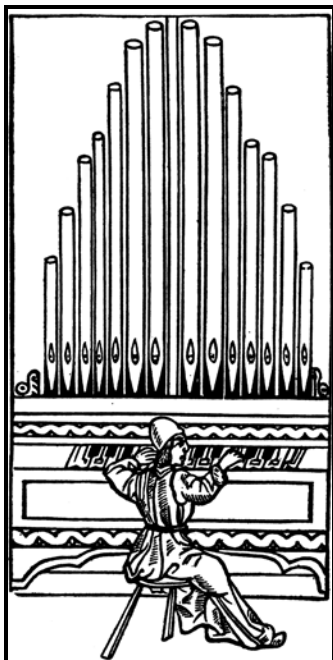

Minutes of Board of Directors Meeting
Tuesday, August 11, 2009

The Board met on Tuesday evening, August 11, 2009, at 7:00 p.m., at Trinity Lutheran Church in Camp Hill. Present: Ken Kline, Karen Worley, Ray Edmison, Doris Savage, Arnold Sten, Mary Jane Nelson, Brian Rice, Robert Carbaugh, Kenneth Walker, Dr. Shirley King, Dr. Ralph Kneeream, Tim Koch, Nicholas Basehore, Julie Jones, Rev. Steven Middernacht. Excused: Fr. James Lease, Deborah Dillane, Tom Notestine. Absent: Shawn Gingrich, Ellen Hunt, Kay Shupp.

Minutes of the April 14, 2009, meeting were approved on a motion by Doris Savage and a second by Rev. Steven Middernacht. Treasurer, Brian Rice, distributed three written reports: Annual Audit for 2008-2009, Statement of Receipts, Disbursements, and Cash in Bank from July 1, 2009 to August 11, 2009; Budget Projections 2009-2010. Reports were approved on a motion by Ken Walker and a second by Ken Kline.

In the absence of the Education Committee Chair, the Dean reported that Bob Bell and Steven Middernacht were awarded Service Playing Certificates. A thank you note from Layton Graves, recipient of a POE scholarship, was read. Doris Savage, chair of the Membership Committee, reported that we presently have 122 members in our Chapter. A list of former Chapter members who have not renewed was circulated. Doris stated that notices, follow-up calls, and membership applications had already been sent to the persons on the list. The Dean requested Board members to contact Doris if they had any ideas on how to further contact these members. Tim Koch, chair of Placement, reported that the list of job openings is constantly being updated. He also stated that an updated list of substitutes will appear in the September *Bombarde*. A chairperson for the Professional Concerns Committee is still needed. The Dean requested that anyone interested in this position should contact him.

Dr. Ralph Kneeream, Sub Dean, stated that there is a \$755 balance left from the programs from the past year. The \$150 gift to the National Endowment fund will be paid by the Treasurer to the National Office in recognition of the visit of the AGO's National President to our Banquet/Installation. The programs for the coming year are based on a \$5,000 budget figure.

Mary Jane Nelson, chair of Publicity, was thanked by the Dean for her excellent report on the Regional III convention in June. Mary Jane reported that the media publicity for the August 23rd Student/Teacher Recital had been distributed. She indicated that current members who have been amenable to having their bio printed in the *Bombarde* are dwindling. The Board suggested that only new members be asked to participate instead of current members. She noted that Kimmel Center's 3:00 p.m. Saturday afternoon Organ Recitals are available in a package of three: Olivier Latry, October 17; Cameron Carpenter, March 6; and Paul Jacobs, May 8.

Dr. Shirley King reported on progress for the 2011 Regional Convention being sponsored by our Chapter. The dates are June 27 through June 30, 2011. The Hilton in Harrisburg has given a special rate of \$99 per night for all rooms, one to four persons per room. The registration fee for the convention will be all inclusive. Sites for programs will be Harrisburg, Camp Hill, York, Annville, and Hershey.

On a motion by Dr. Kneeream and a second by Tim Koch, \$6,736.74 from the Carolyn Evens Memorial Fund was approved to be used by the Steering Committee of the Regional Convention in 2011. Specifics will be worked out and reported back to the Board. The Dean announced that Tony Ciucci will chair the Nominations Committee. On a motion by Rev. Steven Middernacht and a second by Ken Kline, approval was given for sending our membership names and addresses to the SusquehannaValley AGO Chapter for use in a one-time mailing. The Dean reminded Board members to notify him, the secretary, or the Membership Chair of any changes in addresses, phone numbers or e-mail addresses. Meeting adjourned on a motion by Ken Walker and a second by Ken Kline. Next meetings November 10, 2009; January 12, and April 13, 2010.

She holds a Doctorate in Music from the Eastman School of Music and has won several prizes in France where she studied with Marie-Claire Alain and with Daniel Roth. Among her credits as a conductor are performances with the Moscow Symphony Orchestra and the Boston Chamber Orchestra. She studied conducting with Neeme Jarvi and Alexander Polischuk at the St. Petersburg Conservatory. Ms. Leach served on the faculty of Harvard University for 14 years where she was also a conductor and organist. Currently, she is Professor of Music at Towson University in Maryland.

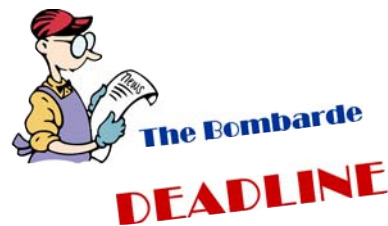
