Cowan to Appear in Camp Hill

On Sunday, April 11, at 4:00 P.M., Ken Cowan, Assistant Professor of Organ at Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ., will present a recital at Camp Hill Presbyterian Church, 101 North 23rd Street, Camp Hill. This concert, which is being sponsored by the Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and the church, will feature a variety of organ music. A free-will offering will be received.

Ken Cowan is one of North America's finest concert organists. Praised for his dazzling artistry, impeccable technique and imaginative programming by audiences and critics alike, he maintains a rigorous performing schedule which takes him to major concert venues across America, Canada and Europe.

Recent and upcoming feature performances include appearances at Grace Cathedral San Francisco, Philadelphia's Verizon Hall, Spivey Hall, Walt Disney Concert Hall, and the Cathedral of Notre-Dame, Paris, France. In addition, Mr. Cowan has been a featured artist in recent years at the national conventions of the American Guild of Organists held in Los Angeles and Minneapolis, has performed at many regional conventions of the AGO, and has been featured at several conventions of the Organ Historical Society and the Royal Canadian College of Organists.

Numerous critically acclaimed compact disc recordings are available by Mr. Cowan. His most recent releases are Ken Cowan Plays Romantic Masterworks (on the Raven label), which was recorded on the 110-rank Schoenstein organ at First Plymouth Congregational Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, and The Art of the Symphonic Organist Vol 4 (on the JAV label), which was recorded on the Michael Quimby organ at First Baptist Church in Jackson Mississippi. In addition to his solo recordings, Mr. Cowan also joined organist Justin Bischof in the world premiere recording of American composer Aaron Miller's Double Concerto for organ, recorded with the Zurich Symphony Orchestra on the Kleuker organ in the Tonhalle, Zurich, Switzerland (Ethereal Recordings). Many of Mr. Cowan's recordings and live performances are regularly featured on the nationally distributed radio show PIPEDREAMS from American Public Media.

A native of Thorold, Ontario, Canada, Mr. Cowan received the Master's degree and Artist Diploma from the Yale Institute of Sacred Music, studying organ with Thomas Murray. Prior to attending Yale, he graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree from the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia where he studied with John Weaver.

Mr. Cowan is Assistant Professor of Organ at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, NJ, where he was recently awarded the 2008 Rider University Distinguished Teaching Award. Previous positions have included Associate Organist and Artist in Residence at Saint Bartholomew's Church, New York City, Assistant Organist posts at St. James Episcopal Church, the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin in New York City, and Saint Clement's Church in Philadelphia. He has also been on the roster of Associate Organists for the famous Wanamaker Grand Court organ in Philadelphia.

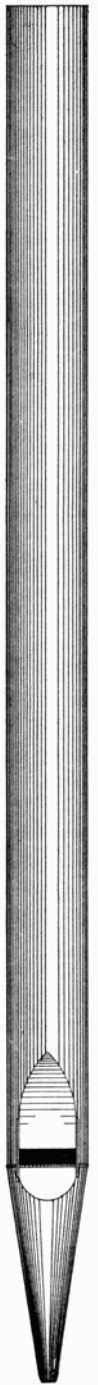

Convention Corner



Dr. Shirley King, our Convention Coordinator, began her report to the Chapter Board on January 12th with the following: *"An underlying thread can be found throughout the planning of the Harrisburg Convention in 2011 – a focus on our youngest musicians – the future of the AGO."* A week or so later when the February issue of "The American Organist" was delivered, James Thomashower approached this theme in his column, stating, *"Here's another trend that we continue to see at the National level, because it reflects what is happening at the Chapter level – the average age of our members is increasing. It's what we call "the graying of the Guild."*

In recognition of this trend, the Convention Steering Committee has planned several avenues through which youth can participate in our 2011 event, with your support. Up front, youthful registrants will have a special lower Registration fee which, along with the reasonable hotel room rate, should be most attractive.

The Regional AGO/Quimby Competition for Young Organists will take place at Trinity Lutheran, Camp Hill, early in Convention week, with the winner playing a recital at that venue the next day. The second place winner will play the prelude on a subsequent day, prior to a choral concert, an opportunity not usually presented to the runner-up.

Three undergraduate students from Peabody, Curtis and Westminster Choir School will play 20-minute segments of organ literature on a recently-installed instrument which several of you have already enjoyed playing.

We know that musical youth are not all geared to the keyboard, having talents in other areas. The Workshop Committee has arranged for a competition to discover two young presenters for our various workshop opportunities. Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman is handling this area, and we await the announcement of the two winners and the topics of their exciting workshops!

Youthful musicians also compose – and yet another competition is in motion to create organ and/or choral and instrumental works that will be featured during the Convention. They could also be printed for availability in future performances. It is planned that the winning composition will be performed on a new instrument being installed this coming year at a church in Hershey.

Maybe you know of a young organist or emerging composer who would benefit from a Convention such as ours, which will have multiple opportunities for the younger generation, in particular. Maybe he or she lives close by, or maybe another state or city claims them. Why not invite them to Harrisburg for a visit during our June 27-30, 2011 Region III Convention? You'll be happy that you did....and so will they!

I hope you are looking forward to meeting and observing Bob Chilcott in action here in Harrisburg in June. A former member of the King's Singers, Bob has been making a name for himself as a composer with a wide stylistic range - from "serious" to jazz to folk. In all, he seems to have a knack for producing high-quality compositions which have that indefinable quality we call accessibility.

Some of you have had questions about this event, so I thought I would provide the information I have at this time. You have seen the schedule of events - Thursday and Friday evening choral rehearsals, a Saturday morning workshop and a Saturday evening concert. AGO members are welcome to observe the choral rehearsals on Thursday and Friday. In my opinion, this is a time to see how Chilcott works with choirs, rather than a time for serious score study. All of the rehearsal literature will be performed in concert. The Saturday morning workshop will feature some of the breadth of Chilcott's compositional output, and scores will be provided for that event. Should you wish to have your own scores of the concert repertoire, here is the list (all are Oxford publications): Jubilate, Canticles of Light (major works); God So Loved the World, Irish Blessing and Walk Softly (these three from his Anthem Book I) and the separate octavo, Now Thank We All Our God.

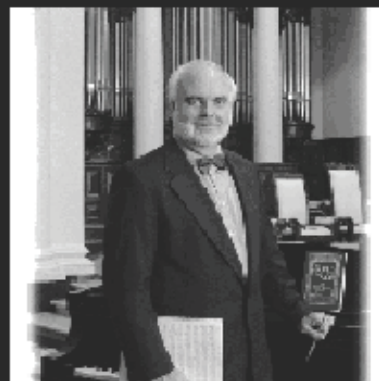

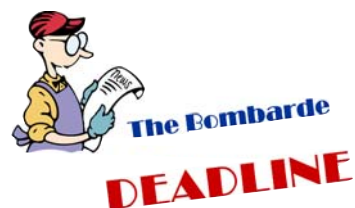
