Convention Corner



With less than a year to go until the Harrisburg Chapter celebrates the 2011 Region III Convention, we thought it helpful to begin focusing on the various committees and the work each has been charged to do. Although each and every committee is integral to the success of the event, it is the **Program Committee** which sets the other committees in motion. The Program Committee deals with three main aspects of the convention: the artists, the composers and commissioned works, and the workshops to be presented, as well as the presenters themselves.

According to Program Committee chairman Thomas Clark-Jones, to first identify and make contact with artists who are in some way connected with Region III, and then select forums from which they can perform for their peers, were the most challenging parts of this initial process. The Program Committee is pleased to announce that the program includes the renowned and flamboyant Hector Olivera; Professor of Organ at the University of Pennsylvania, Diane Meredith Belcher; Professor of Organ and Artist in Residence at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana, Craig Cramer; and Professor of Organ at Lebanon Valley College, Shelly Moorman-Stahlman. All will be performing recitals during the convention. Also performing will be Rhonda Sider Edgington, Marcos Krieger and Mark Laubach.

With special emphasis on young organists and composers, ("the future of AGO"), the committee has included a recital by the "Stars of the Future". These young recitalists are from three great conservatories in the Region III area, Curtis, Peabody & Westminster Choir College. There will be a recital given by the Quimby Regional Competition Winner and the winning composition of the Young Composer Competition will be played during a recital. Also included in the program will be a prelude given by the 2nd place Quimby Competition winner.

Selecting the venue and instruments from which to offer these recitals was important and needed to reflect sounds from the traditional pipe organs as well as the latest in electronic organs. Once again, our Program Committee did an outstanding job.

All this, in conjunction with commissioned works and educational workshops, helped the Program Committee to shape the program for an exciting convention, give it a forum, and infuse in it a spirit of opportunity that will extend to the participants in every phase of the preparation and execution of this momentous event in the life of our chapter.

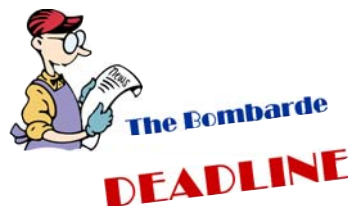
