

2011 Region III AGO Convention June 27-30, 2011 Call for Workshop Presenters (Two divisions)

(A) Age 15-24 Years Old or(B) Young Professional-Age 32 and Younger

In celebration of the many talents of the young professionals in organ and church music in Region III, the Harrisburg American Guild of Organists Chapter is inviting interested young professionals (age 32 and younger) to submit a proposal to present a workshop at the Region III Convention on June 27-30, 2011.

Candidates must have a permanent residence in Region III or attend a college in Region III. Topics may include any area of organ literature, pedagogy, or church music related topics.

To submit a proposal:

- Send a 2 page draft outlining your workshop topic and the format that you plan to use. Be sure to include your name, address, email, and date of birth.
- 2. If possible, include a video tape or a handout for your workshop.
- 3. Include 2 letters of recommendation by professionals who have observed your scholarly activity and your ability to bring material alive in a workshop format (please do not read your paper at the workshop)
- 4. Send your proposal to Ralph Kneeream, Region III Workshop Committee, 304 Forgedale Drive; Carlisle, PA 17015.
- 5. All proposals must be received by January 15, 2011.
- 6. The proposals will be reviewed by a committee and two contestants will be selected to present their workshop at the Region III Convention (one from the 15-24 year old category; and one from the Young Professional category-32 and younger category)
- 7. All entrants will be notified by Feb. 15, 2011.
- 8. The selected clinicians will receive a \$250 honorarium after their presentation at the convention.



Convention Corner



In order for a convention to be successful, you need people to attend it. The key goals of the Publicity Committee are to promote attendance and increase the public's awareness of the organ in the Harrisburg area. The Program Committee has done an excellent job in putting together a wonderful event reflecting the Region III talent and strengths. Now it is up to the Publicity Committee to create and provide the media to promote it.

You may wonder what the Publicity Committee has been doing since we started to meet in early 2009. The first duty of the committee was to discuss and plan for a theme and a logo for our 2011 Regional Convention. Several were suggested, consid-

ered, revised and finally chosen, all illustrated by the artistic talents of Dick Beane's son, Bryan Beane. Following that choice, stationery, envelopes, business cards and thank you notes were designed and printed. Our first major project was planning for booth materials at the 2009 Region III convention hosted by the Tidewater Chapter in Norfolk, Virginia.

Kathy Gates is chairing the Publicity Committee as well as her appointment as Registrar, since the duties of the two committees were so closely related. We developed an ad for the Tidewater Regional and National Convention in Washington, DC program booklets to advertise the 2011 Region III convention in Harrisburg. With the help of other Steering Committee members, we hosted a booth at both the Tidewater and Washington conventions.

Since the official colors of the Harrisburg chapter are Silver and Crimson, the logo was designed using those two colors. We hope that you all have seen the convention logo and information related to the Harrisburg Chapter web site at Harrisburgago.com. We hired Alpha Graphics in Camp Hill to create and print most of the publicity materials including a banner, the promotional bag clips, stationery and brochures. Starting in the February 2010 Bombarde, we began our "Convention Corner" articles to keep the Harrisburg Chapter members informed of preparations for the convention to be held on June 27-30, 2011 at the Hilton Harrisburg hotel.

For the National Convention in 2010, our Print Media chair, Mary Jane Nelson created a wonderful informational triptych and displayed it on an easel showcasing our major recitalists and other salient pieces of information about our Regional convention. The feedback has been wonderful. Besides the free Hershey kisses, there has been a lot of interest in the low hotel rate of \$99 (+ tax) per night for up to 4 persons in a room. More than a few passers-by made note of the convention dates.

The Publicity Committee has also been responsible for developing a convention web site to handle online registrations and payments. The committee anticipates having this web site available for early registration beginning on January 1, 2011 with special early registration rates effective until March 1, 2011. All registration rates and categories are posted on the Harrisburg chapter web site in the "convention" section. Registration includes admission to all events, three meals, plus transportation.

I am privileged to be writing to you in behalf of the Philadelphia AGO Chapter and inviting you to our annual <u>January Jumpstart on January 15, 2011</u> – a FREE all-day workshop for the church musician seeking new ideas for a new year. This is our Fifth Year in this expanded format and we are eager to share it with any of you able to make the pilgrimage to Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania on a brisk January Saturday(PS We have never been snowed out!) Every year you can count on finding new inspiration in our organ repertoire, anthem reading sessions, handbell courses and children's choir sessions. This year we have added the special excitement of spiritual drumming (bring a drum!) and music software for church use. Come for the shopping in Youngs' Music (our onsite music store stocked with the music presented in the sessions and much more), come to connect with new friends in our profession, ... come for a January rejuvenation!

I urge you to attend and bring a friend so you can split up and cover twice as many workshop sessions. We will be gathering together at 11:30 for a 30-minute worship service in the church's beautiful sanctuary, and following up with food and fellowship over lunch (you can pay for the catered luncheon or brown-bag it and sit with us.)

Organlive Makes it Easy to Experience the Music of the Organ

Organlive.com is an Internet audio station dedicated to the music of the classical organ. Broadcasting since 2003, Organlive has become the most-heard organ station on the Internet. The broadcast is completely free to anyone with a broadband Internet connection and is now easier than ever to tune in. Listeners simpy need one click at www.organlive.com to hear the broadcast through Windows Media Player, WinAmp, iTunes, Quicktime, RealPlayer, or any streaming MP3 player. Additionally the stream may be heard on most mobile devices such as the iPhone or Android based phones. The station is also listed in the classical radio stations on iTunes.

A new website makes it easier to search the ever-growing library of organ music, which currently holds over 10,000 tracks from more than 850 albums of music recorded by organists all over the world. Listeners can log in to rate tracks and albums as well as leave comments on the same. Organlive plays albums recorded on pipe, digital, and combination organs played by the world's best concert organists, as well as tracks recorded and submitted by less renowned organists. Included are pairings of organ and orchestra, solo instruments, choir, or vocal solos. The listener is presented with the work title, composer, album title, a link to purchase the album or MP3 online, the organ, it's builder, size, and location, and a link to the specification of the organ being heard, and often a link to public domain copy of the sheet music of the work.

Listeners may browse the entire library searching by work, composer, organist, album, or organ and request tracks to be played. On Sundays the station features hymns, choral anthems, and music of the church. Monday's playlist consists of music from the 19th and 20th centuries. Wednesdays are all-baroque music, and Fridays feature the best music from our library, as rated by the listeners.

The station has been continually funded by the listeners, and an annual budget covering all operating expenses is raised every spring.
