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From the Dean

Dear Chapter Members:

Thank you to those members who helped to make our January Program at the Church of the Good Shepherd in Camp Hill a resounding success. A delicious Buffet Supper was served to more than 50 chapter members and guests. Shirley King and members of the Convention Steering Committee gave an update on plans for the June Harrisburg Region III Convention. The Members' Recital/Organ Plus Program was enjoyed by all, a fine conclusion to a great evening. Thank you to our host, Anthony Ciucci, our Program Chair, Robert Lau, our performers—to all who participated in the evening's success.

And what an evening it was. What a way to begin 2011! Just before the program began, Lynn Ronan, a chapter member, presented a check for ten thousand dollars to the Harrisburg Chapter, monies to be used for the training of young organists, young church musicians. Ida Enck Throne, our benefactor, was a former organist at Mt. Zion Lutheran Church, Churchtown, the church presently served by Lynn Ronan. Mrs. Throne was a member, in later years, of St. John's Lutheran Church, Boiling Springs, where our chapter secretary, Kenneth Walker, is the organist. The Harrisburg Chapter is deeply indebted to Lynn and Ken for their help in securing these funds from Mrs. Throne's estate. In addition to the Shenk Scholarships, we will have, also, Throne Scholarships. At a recent Education Committee meeting there was a discussion on the possibility of expanding our summer organ scholarship program. Of course, there was the inevitable question: Do we have enough funds? A committee member remarked, "God will provide." Sure enough, three days later I received the good news of the Throne bequest. Indeed, as the hymn text states, "God moves in mysterious ways, his wonders to perform."

Plan to attend our next chapter program on Sunday, February 13, at 4:00 PM. St. Lawrence Chapel, 110 State Street, Harrisburg, is an architectural "jewel," a beautiful space in which to experience the ancient liturgy of Vespers. Father James Lease, our Chaplain, and Nicholas Basehore, Cathedral Director of Music, will give us an historical perspective on Latin Vespers, and conclude the afternoon, as the day is ended, as darkness falls, with the service, itself. If you have never experienced this liturgy, or if you have experienced it many times, sung Vespers is always a beautiful way to end the day. This event is both an educational and inspirational program, and you will want to be there.

As a Harrisburg Chapter AGO member, you have until March 1 to take advantage of the early Registration rate for the June Region III Convention. Have you been playing endless *Magnificat* fugues, but rarely (if ever) sung the *Magnificat* itself in a service? Have you been humming along to Monteverdi's *Vespers*, listening to stunning settings of the *Dixit Dominus*, wishing that you could participate in the services for which these were written? Maybe you've blown the dust off of the *Evening Prayer* section of your congregation's hymnal, and you've been wondering "Where did this come from, what's it mean, and why is it important for today?" Maybe you've been pining to get together in a gorgeous church at the close of the day to sing hymns, psalms, and spiritual canticles. Well, the time of your lamentation is at an end!

As part of the AGO's mission of education, Fr. James Lease and Mr. Nicholas Basehore will present *An Introduction to Vespers* from 4:00 – 5:30 PM on February 13, 2011 (otherwise known as the Octave of the Superbowl) at the strikingly beautiful St. Lawrence Chapel, 110 State Street, Harrisburg. The afternoon will feature:

- \Rightarrow a talk on the origin, development, and importance of Vespers by Fr. Lease
- ⇒ a review of the music for the service, with a crash course in Gregorian chant (*don't panic, it's just three short antiphons...*)
- \Rightarrow accompaniment by the newly rebuilt chapel organ
- \Rightarrow the celebration of Vespers with a (short but engaging) homily by Fr. Lease

Zion church. The church council decided that it would be appropriate to give the sum of \$10,000 to the Harrisburg A.G.O. as a tribute to Ida and to help in the training of young organists.

On Sunday, January 9, a new hymn tune and text was premiered in the recital by Joan Lippincott on the new Letourneau organ at First United Methodist Church, Hershey. Chapter member **Robert Lau** composed the text "O Lord, our God, we sing your praise" and the tune, which he named "Gingrich" for **Shawn Gingrich**, music director at the church. The capacity crowd of 375 sang the hymn and then Dr. Lippincott played the 5 variations on the tune for organ solo which Dr. Lau also wrote for the occasion. "Thank you Robert for a fantastic addition to the hymn repertory and organ literature."

At the national convention of the American Choral Directors Association to be held in Chicago from March 9-12, our member **Robert Lau** will have the distinct honor of being the presenter of his anthem *Sing to the Lord a New Song* at the Music and Worship reading session. One of only 15 anthems chosen for the session, the work was chosen from thousands submitted by music publishing companies across the United States. Robert will also be leading a reading session sponsored by Paraclete Press at the convention.

In celebration of the many talents of the young professionals in organ and church music in Region III, the Harrisburg American Guild of Organists Chapter is inviting interested young professionals (age 32 and younger) to submit a proposal to present a workshop at the Region III Convention on June 27-30, 2011.

Candidates must have a permanent residence in Region III or attend a college in Region III. Topics may include any area of organ literature, pedagogy, or church music related topics.

To submit a proposal:

- 1. Send a 2 page draft outlining your workshop topic and the format that you plan to use. Be sure to include your name, address, email, and date of birth.
- 2. If possible, include a video tape or a handout for your workshop.
- 3. Include 2 letters of recommendation by professionals who have observed your scholarly activity and your ability to bring material alive in a workshop format (please do not read your paper at the workshop)
- Send your proposal to Ralph Kneeream, Region III Workshop Committee, 304 Forgedale Drive; Carlisle, PA 17015.
- 5. All proposals must be received by January 15, 2011.
- 6. The proposals will be reviewed by a committee and two contestants will be selected to present their workshop at the Region III Convention (one from the 15-24 year old category; and one from the Young Professional category-32 and younger category)
- 7. All entrants will be notified by February 15, 2011.
- 8. The selected clinicians will receive a \$250 honorarium after their presentation at the convention.

Vernon de Tar Scholarship Competition Delaware Chapter, American Guild of Organists

Information Sheet: 2011 Competition

The Vernon de Tar Scholarship Competition was established by the Delaware Chapter, American Guild of Organists to honor the late Dr. Vernon de Tar, internationally known organist, church musician, and teacher, for his many contributions to the profession over his long and distinguished career.

The scholarship provides for two prizes annually, one for an organist with limited playing experience (Level A), and one for a more advanced organist (Level B). This year, prizes include tuition for a summer, 2010 AGO-sponsored Pipe Organ Encounter, and a cash award of \$200, payable after attendance at a POE. The goal of the competition is to immerse the two young musician-winners in events focusing on the organ, and to foster in them a keen interest in the organ and in church music.

Competition for the Vernon de Tar Scholarship is open to organ students who are from 12 to 18 years of age, as of the date of the competition, and who reside within Region III, the Mid-Atlantic Region of the American Guild of Organists: Delaware, Maryland, southern New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia. Applicants must perform at the competition, which will be held at First and Central Presbyterian Church in Wilmington, Delaware on Saturday, April 9, 2011, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The repetitoire requirements for the competition are as follows:

Level A

- 1. A prelude or fugue (one movement) from one of Bach's "Eight Little Preludes and Fugues."
- 2. A contrasting composition.

Level B

- 1. A large prelude and fugue of J. S. Bach.
- 2. A contrasting *introspective* composition from the 19th or 20th century.

The decision of the judges will be considered final. Judges have the right to award no prize.
