Tips for Organists

The Buch Church Organ Company website has some helpful tips for the church organist. Below is a sample.

Several areas of music require attention which have a degree of flexibility and at the same time need some type of fixed parameters to fulfill their application. One such area is 'tempo'. Choice of a good tempo can make or break the performance of a piece of music. There are a number of factors involved in selecting a tempo for a particular piece of music. Consider the following items (here listed in a very general order of importance):

- Tempo as indicated by composer.
- Style / Character of the piece.
- Mood / desired "feeling" for the piece.
- Acoustics.
- Historical Period.

When one receives an e-mail from an address such as "iowamusmom," some interesting images arise. Beth Palmer was born and raised in Southeast Iowa along the Mississippi River. She began at an early age to study both piano and violin, and at the age of 11 began organ lessons with Juanita Jamison in Burlington, Iowa. By her junior high and high school years, she was well skilled to hold organ positions in various churches.



Her music study did not stop there. She graduated from Drake University, Des Moines, with a Bachelor of Music degree in Organ and Church Music, studying with Carl Staplin and Arthur Poister. At the same time, she also earned a Bachelor of Music Education degree. Church positions in Des Moines included Organist at the Cathedral of St. Paul (Episcopal), and Director of Music at the Basilica of St. John. She enjoyed touring with the Mansfield University Concert Choir, which performed at Yale University, and in Pittsburgh and Carlisle, where she performed the Kodaly "Missa Brevis" with that group.

Beth is now employed at St. Joan of Arc Church in Hershey where she enjoys directing four choirs and scheduling cantors for weekend masses, along with organ responsibilities.

As a world traveler, Beth has enjoyed a choir trip to England, and a vacation to Peru. Recent travels have taken her to Paris and Rome. Besides traveling, her hobbies include biking, hiking, gardening and spending time with her four children, ranging in age from 20 to 33.

Beth made her 'debut' in our chapter's *Organ Plus* program this past January at Good Shepherd Church in Camp Hill, and has recently been elected to the Board for a three-year term. Also in the past year, she performed works by Bach, Dupré, Franck, Clerambault and Vierne on the organ at the Cathedral Parish of St. Patrick in their *Music Under the Dome* series.

Dr. Baik-Kim serves on the faculty at Dickinson College and is a devoted collaborative artist. She performs extensively covering a wide range of major repertoires from Baroque to 21st century music of vocal art songs and instrumental chamber music. As a recipient of the Performance Accompanying Grant at Temple University, she had chance to develop her skills as a collaborative pianist with the guidance of renowned pianist Lambert Orkis. She continued to study with Rita Sloan at the University of Maryland, and recently earned her Doctorate of Musical Arts. Her primary teachers include Harvey Weeden, George Sementovsky, Edward Roberts, David Burge, Gilberto Tinetti, Lambert Orkis and Rita Sloan.
