The event is held in full partnership with Macy's.

Because the orchestra will be on the balcony in front of the organ, the best seats for hearing and seeing the orchestra musicians are in the *back* of the Grand Court, with the very prime seats directly opposite the Organ or opposite the Console in raked rows on the Second Floor. See the chart below for details. There are seats available for every pocketbook. Ticket proceeds benefit the Friends of the Wanamaker Organ. Tickets are on sale now exclusively at <u>SymphonyinC.org</u>.

Free sound and visual presentations will also be offered in Greek Hall earlier in the day: Rick Seifert will give his acclaimed presentation on the Wanamaker Organ at 10:15 AM and Agnes Armstrong will discuss Alexandre Guilmant, Wizard of the Organ at 2 PM.
