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From the Dean

I have suggested to our Program Committee that we have a program highlighting the benefits of earning Guild Certification. Our Newsletter Editor is planning to include in *The Bombarde*, from time to time, those chapter members who have passed various AGO examinations. Chapter funds are available to members to help defray the costs associated with applying, securing materials, and preparing for an examination. Pipe Organ Encounters (POE) is the most successful outreach program sponsored by the American Guild of Organists. POEs offer both teenagers and adults a chance to learn more about organ playing and organ building. Our chapter has sponsored some POE attendees. I hope that more of our members and their students will attend a POE, a POE Advanced, a POE Technical, or a POE Plus. The Chapter's proposed "Operating Procedures" was unanimously approved by the Board at its February 7 meeting. A copy of this document will be sent to every chapter member, and a vote will be taken at our Annual Meeting in May. If the document is ratified by the Chapter, it must be approved by both the Regional Councillor and the National Vice-President. It is critical that the Chapter Officers, the Members-at-Large, and the various Chairs have their 'job descriptions' available. An attempt was made in 2005 to develop such a document. It was never ratified by the chapter. I want to express deep appreciation to our Ad-Hoc Chapter Procedures Committee–Shirley King (chair), Ellen Hunt, and Brian Rotz–for creating this document. It is based on both the AGO National Bylaws and the distinctive needs of the Harrisburg Chapter.

I hope to see many members at Dr. Robert Lau's Workshop, "Making the Most of Your Anthem," on Saturday, March 10, 9:30 am, at St. Stephen's Cathedral, Harrisburg. This program will be most helpful to every choir director in our Chapter.

Making the Most of Your Anthem" Robert Lau, Clinician



One of the most common complaints I hear from choir directors is that they can't sing a particular anthem because it doesn't "fit their choir." Their reasons are many: "it's too difficult", "it's too easy", "it doesn't have enough part singing", "it has too much part singing", "we don't sing unison or two-part anthems", etc., etc. As a result I think many interesting anthems are passed over. This workshop explores different approaches to "arranging" anthems so that they are practical for your use. In conjunction with arranging we will also explore some rehearsal techniques which may make your anthem even more effective.

Minutes of the August 9, 2011, meeting were approved with the following corrections: Stephen Middernacht should be Steven Middernacht, in paragraph 4 it should be stated that "a Finance Committee has been formed" rather than that a discussion will follow on the formation of a Finance Committee. Treasurer Brian Rice presented written and oral statements of receipts, disbursements, cash in the bank, and investments/funds for the period August 9, 2011/November 8, 2011. The Treasurer's Report was filed to audit.

Dean Dr. Ralph Kneeream presented his report orally. The Dean thanked all Board Members for their commitment to

our chapter. Esther Long was welcomed to the board to serve the remaining two years of Ryan Brunkhurst's term. The following were welcomed as new chairs of their respective committees:. Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman / Education Committee, Jim Acri / Finance Committee, Rev. Dr. Darrell Woomer /Competition Committee, Dr. Shirley King / Ad-Hoc Chapter Procedures Committee. Chuck Yocum was thanked for representing our Chapter at the Memorial Service for our former Dean, Mary Walsh. Doris Savage and Brian Rice were thanked for the work they did in pulling together the Chapter Membership Directory for this season. Dr. Shawn Gingrich, Dr. Robert Lau and Deb Dillane were thanked for the Chapter programs in August, September, and October, respectively. A thank-you note was received from AGO Headquarters for the \$400 gift to the Annual Fund. James Thomashower sent a congratulatory letter for the Convention, which the Dean read. A reminder was given concerning the Jumpstart at the Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church on Saturday, January 9, 2012. The Dean reported that because of hotel and printing bills, Treasurer Brian Rice applied to the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue for tax-exempt status for our Chapter. The application was denied and an appeal was filed. As of the present, there is no further report on the matter.

Sub Dean Dr. Robert Lau requested ideas for next year's programs. There were no reports from the Communications or Competition Committees.

In the excused absence of Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman, Dr. Shawn Gingrich reported on the Education Committee Meeting that was held in Hershey in October. A motion was made that \$7,500 from the Regional Convention profits be moved to the Shenk Scholarship Fund to insure the next five years of the scholarship. This was passed with a unanimous vote. The Education Committee also reported on proposed use of monies from the Ida Enck Throne estate. Suggestions were: use monies to train members of our Chapter for the Certifications of the Guild, new scholarships for POE+, provide financial stipends for Chapter members preparing for Guild Certifications, provide financial assistance for Chapter members to attend conventions, conferences and workshops.

Based on the profit from our Regional Convention, the Finance Committee made a motion to send \$5,000, which we received from the Ohio Valley Chapter, to help with our Regional Convention, to the Winchester Chapter for their Regional Convention in 2013. The motion was amended to include the statement that if Winchester makes a profit they should consider sending monies to the next Chapter hosting a Regional Convention. The amended motion was passed on a 15 to 5 vote.

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Charles Yocum, Historian and Chair of the Archives Committee, will go to the State Archives and search for materials of our Chapter that seem to be unlisted in the Archives of the State.

Doris Savage, Membership Committee Chair and Registrar, reported that our Chapter presently has 131 members in various categories. A committee has been formed to encourage Chapter members to attend meetings. The Lunch Bunch continues to meet on a regular basis. The Membership Yearbooks for this season are available.

The Nominations Committee has been formed for this year under the leadership of Anthony Ciucci.

Tim Koch, Placement, reported there are four openings at the present time listed with him and that the substitute list is up to date.

Rev. Steven Middernacht, Professional Development, reported that the Committee has begun collecting data on organist compensation for weddings and funerals. He also reported that there was one case of a requested grievance; but the Committee felt after investigation that there was no grievance in this case.

Dr. Robert Lau, Program Committee, reported that there will be a catered dinner preceding the January program at Camp Hill United Methodist Church.

Mary Jane Nelson, Publicity, reported that articles on our last three programs have been sent to the American Organist magazine. Mini bios of Chapter members are going to return to The Bombarde .
