## Dupré and Kneeream

A glimpse through the window of memories into the life and work of Marcel Dupré and his musical mentors and friends, by former Dupré student, Ralph Kneeream, was enjoyed by a group of 30-some chapter members and guests on Saturday, April 21, at the U.S. Army War College, Carlisle Barracks. (See photo below.)

Those of us who chose to be at Ralph's workshop on Dupré during last summer's Region III Convention found our interest heightened by his presentation, and we desired to experience more details when time would allow. This was the time!

The morning began with a Welcome by the Installation Chaplain, Col. Fr. Gregory J. D'Emma, who explained the significance of the Chapel of the Four Chaplains, in which we were seated. Dr. Douglas Johnson, Historian, related many interesting facts about this site, from 1757 to the present. Officers from 67 countries are now affiliated with the school and its activities.

Ralph's stories about Dupré, his teachers, students and other colleagues were fascinating, as were the photos and historical recordings he shared. Some of the noteworthy bits of information I gleaned that morning (as a page-turner, not an organist) were the following: (1) The organ in Dupré's home had 73 keys in each manual; (2) Dupré played the organ in public at the age of 8, and had his first church organist job at the age of 12; (3) St. Sulpice in Paris is larger than the Notre Dame Cathedral; (4) Widor was a substitute organist for 70 years...all at the same venue. He married at age 76 and died at 93; (5) In 1920, Dupré gave 10 recitals covering all Bach's organ works, from memory, at the age of 34. I'm sure that those who have performed works by these masters absorbed much greater musical truths!

We thank Ralph for his willingness to do this program for a second time and sharing with us facts about some of the most exciting musical lives, including Guilmont, Widor, Franck, Vierne, Duruflé, Messiaen and Tournemire. It is a privilege to know so much more about them and will inspire my greater appreciation of their works in the future.

Thanks again, Ralph, for your time, talents and memories!



## A new "continuo" organ for Market Square Church

Almost as soon as I arrived in Harrisburg back in November of 2007, conversations began around Market Square Church concerning appropriate use of memorial funds donated in memory and honor of the late Dr. Pierce A. Getz. Over the course of these few years many ideas have been tossed around, with none of them feeling quite right. Then, in casual conversation, one of the choir members mentioned her strong recollection of Pierce sitting at a small "continuo" organ that he sometimes borrowed from Lebanon Valley College when the choir was performing something down at the front of the church sanctuary (the main organ and choir loft are in the back). The idea of purchasing a small pipe organ as a memorial to Pierce Getz took root and seemed like a great idea to virtually everyone, including the Getz family.

After internet research and a few short trips, I recommended the purchase of a new portable organ built by the Vagi firm in Budapest, Hungary. It is a lovely, little thing with a beautiful, colorful sound and a very clever design. It arrived last October just in time for use with the Central PA Oratorio Singers' performance of the Haydn "Little Organ" Mass. I must say it was just perfect for the part. The organ consists of three ranks of pipes - flutes at 8' and 4' and a 2' principal. It uses mechanical action and has a "transposing" keyboard, useful when playing with early music groups who tune to A-415. You can see and hear this actual instrument on video by searching "Vagi continuo organ" on YouTube. Feel free to stop in anytime to check out this little addition to the Harrisburg organ scene.

## Harrisburg Ensemble Travels to Italy
