Bequest to Harrisburg Chapter Avails Musical Instruments

Patricia Frysinger, long-time Chapter member and past Dean of the Harrisburg Chapter named the Chapter in her will as recipients of a piano and an organ. Both instruments are available for sale to Chapter members first. Interest in purchase must be made by November 2, 2012 after which other avenues of sale will be explored.

The piano was built in 2002 by the Czech Republic builder, Petrof. It is a model IV (5'7") in black ebony. This instrument is in Pat's South Carolina vacation home near Myrtle Beach. The asking price is \$7,500. The buyer is responsible for costs of moving which may be about \$750.

The organ was built in 1985 by the Holland builder Johannus. It is a model Opus 230 and is an analogue electronic instrument. The board has enacted an evaluation by a local technician and has not yet set an asking price, but interested persons should register their interest so that further details can be shared as soon as they are known. The organ is in Pat's house here in Harrisburg.

Emeritus Professor of Organ at the Paris Conservatory of Music, where she taught from 1988 to 2011, Mme Langlais also held positions as professor of organ and improvisation at the National Regional Conservatory of Marseille (1974-1987) and at the Schola Cantorum (1985-2007). This Fall, she is Distinguished Visiting Professor of Organ at The Oberlin Conservatory of Music.


Andreas Scholl coming to Lancaster


Hershey Handbell Ensemble Releases New Christmas CD
