From the Dean

The chapter is grateful to Robert Lau, Shawn Gingrich, Timothy Koch, and Charles Yocum for presenting the "Anthems with Solo Instruments" Workshop on November 3. Thanks, also, to Tim for hosting the event at Trinity Lutheran Church, Camp Hill, and to Karen Appel, Hospitality Chair, for preparing a delicious Continental Breakfast, enjoyed as folks arrived. About twenty-five chapter members participated in this interesting and helpful chapter program.

Our chapter has been chosen as one of four 2013 Quimby Competition Centers in Region III, the Philadelphia Chapter, the Lehigh Valley Chapter, and the Pittsburgh Chapter completing the roster. I want to thank our Competition Chair, the Rev. Dr. D. Darrell Woome, for his efforts in gathering information and for completing the application to host this Competition, a fine opportunity for young organists. (Our Chapter Board had voted to submit an Application.) A maximum of six young organists will compete for a one-thousand-dollar first prize and a five-hundred-dollar second prize. The Competition will be held at Carlisle's First Lutheran Church in April. Subsequently, our first prize winner will compete against the other three winners at the Region III Convention in Winchester, Virginia. More details will be published by our Competition Chair in both Quick News and in the January Newsletter.

As announced in the November Issue of *The Bombarde*, Patricia Frysinger, a former Dean, bequeathed her Petrof Grand Piano and her Johannus Organ to our chapter. I want to thank Shawn Gingrich for his efforts in arranging for the sale of these two instruments. The piano, located in Pat's South Carolina home, has

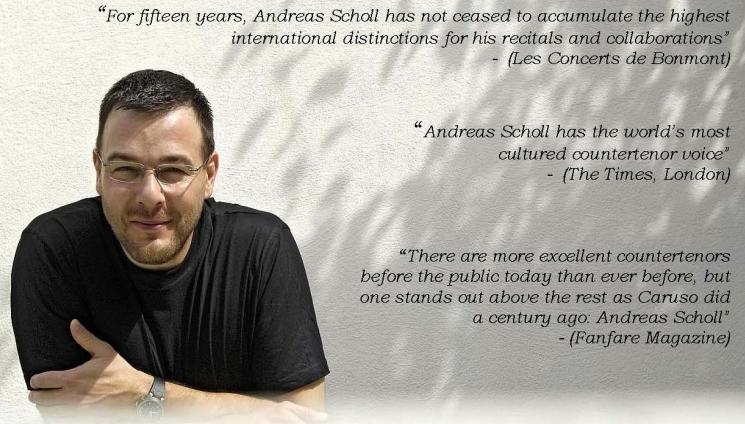
