A frequent performer on organ and harpsichord, he has presented recitals in the U.S. and Europe and has performed in Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center in New York City and several times with the Maryland Symphony Orchestra. Widely known for his skills as an improviser and workshop leader, he has served as clinician and hymn festival leader across the U.S. Wold is the composer of over 300 published compositions, many of which were commissioned by individuals or organizations, and he is the author of three books, all on the topic of the spiritual and musical development of church choirs and directors. Published by Augsburg Fortress Publishers, his three books are entitled Tune My Heart to Sing: Devotions for Choirs Based on the Revised Common Lectionary; Preaching to the Choir: The Care and Nurture of the Church Choir; and Soli Deo Gloria: Choir Devotions for Year C.

Other institutions where she has taught include Highbridge Voices (Outstanding Teacher Award) and Stagecoach Theatre Arts School. Ms. Tennill is currently Private Vocal Instructor at the world-renowned St. Thomas Choir School where she provides each chorister with private as well as group vocal instruction.
