#### **Dale Wood Remembered**

Recently I played a noon-day recital for the Philadelphia chapter at the First Presbyterian Church in Phoenixville; one of the pieces I played was a beautiful setting of *Brother James' Air* by Dale Wood. After the recital, the editor of *Crescendo*, Mib Campbell, asked if I would add something to my program notes regarding Dale Wood, for publication in the *Crescendo*, since the year 2013 will mark the tenth anniversary of the composer's death.

Dale was for many years Organist and Choirmaster in San Francisco at the Episcopal Church of St. Mary the Virgin, as well as director of the Grace Cathedral Boys' Chorus. He served in a similar capacity in Lutheran churches in Hollywood, and Riverside, California. He was Executive Editor of the Sacred Music Press from 1975-1996.

Dale Wood was known throughout the musical community as a master of melody, and "the difficult art of simplicity." In addition to his prolific volume of published choral works and hymn tunes, his compositions for handbells, harp, and organ are performed on a regular basis throughout the world.

On a personal note, I enjoy playing several titles from his Wood Works for Organ (1986), including Be Thou My Vision, Were You There?, The Ash Grove, Amazing Grace, The King of Love My Shepherd Is, Wondrous Love, People Look East, 'Twas in the Moon of Wintertime, Though I May Speak and That Easter Day With Joy Was Bright. From his collection entitled Lyric Pieces for Organ (2001), I have performed the following pieces: Antiphon, Paean, and Aria.

# Fine Arts at First to Host Concert Pianist Harriette Line Thompson



Harriette Line Thompson, concert pianist, will present a recital at First Lutheran Church, 21 Bedford South Street, Carlisle on Sunday, June 30 at PM. 3:00 Her performance will feature the music of Chopin.

Fine Arts at First is honored to welcome Harriette's return to its series since her

2005 concert. She shares a special connection to First Lutheran, her childhood home church. It was from the freewill offering received at her 1982 piano recital presented at Dickinson College, which was sponsored by members of the church, that the fine arts series came into being. Fine Arts at First launched its inaugural season a decade later with the 1993-1994 Series and is now celebrating its 20<sup>th</sup> season.

Harriette began her musical training in Carlisle at age seven as a student of her mother, Harriet Brenneman Line (Mrs. J. Harvey Line). When she was eight years old, she rode her bicycle thirteen miles to and from her Saturday lessons in Mechanicsburg to study with a Peabody-trained teacher. Further study included degrees from Syracuse University, the New England Conservatory of Music, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and the Vienna Conservatory of Music in Austria. She has served on the faculties of Boston University, Queens University, and University of North Carolina at Charlotte. While pursuing her concert and teaching career, Harriette and her husband, Sydnor, reared five children.

The pianist's tours have taken her to New Zealand, Australia, Southeast Asia, and throughout Europe and the United States. She served as concert soloist for eight years on board the Queen Elizabeth II. She has played in New York's Carnegie Hall, and since 1977, she has served as Summer Music Director for the Aspen Chapel in Colorado.

Along with her love of music is Harriette's passion for running. She has run fourteen 26-mile marathons in San Diego, California, beginning in 1998 when she was 76 years old. To this point, she has raised over \$100,000 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's research through contributions from family and friends. She has won many running awards, including a trophy acknowledging her as the oldest runner ever to finish the San Diego Marathon and the Masters Distance Running Award from the USA Track and Field Masters Award for females in the 85-89 year group. Residing in Charlotte, North Carolina, Harriette celebrated her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday in April.

The concert is free to all with a freewill offering to be received. A reception to greet "Hattie", as she is known to friends, will follow the recital. # Harrisburg Chapter, American Guild of Organists Executive Committee, Tuesday, April 30, 2013

The Executive Committee of the Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists met at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 30, 2013, at Trinity Lutheran Church in Camp Hill. The Dean called the meeting to order and read Psalm 150 as the Invocation. The Secretary called the roll with the following present: Dr. Ralph Kneeream, Dr. Shawn Gingrich, Brian Rice, Kenneth Walker, Robert Bell, Carol Hunter, Beth Palmer, Brian Rotz, Esther Long, Anna Royer. Excused were: Tom Notestine and Ellen Hunt.

On a motion by Esther Long with a second by Dr. Shawn Gingrich the monies from the Clapper and Frysinger bequests amounting to \$7,200 will be placed in a fund to be named The Clapper/Frysinger Recital Fund and used for organ recitals featuring "rising stars" in organ performance. On a motion by Carol Hunter and a second by Anna Royer an amendment to the first motion was made that the Program Committee will select the organists for the recitals with preference to young organists from Region III.

Under New Business Phyllis Conrad was approved as Chair of the Hospitality Committee. Josephine Freund was ratified to the Class of 2012/2015 to fill the vacancy on the Board left by the resignation of Georgia Clements. The Historian/Archivist Committee will be split into two Committees with Charles Yocum remaining as Historian Chair and Ken Walker becoming Archivist Committee Chair.

On a motion by Carol Hunter and a second by Esther Long it is suggested that an Ad Hoc Committee be created in the near future to look into our Chapter Procedures for any necessary changes that may be needed. In keeping with our Chapter Procedures the Secretary is to keep charge of the Procedures and any changes.

Dr. Ralph Kneeream will contact other members of the Board through electronic voting on the above matters.

The Dean introduced Glenn L. Rodgers, Councilor for Region III. Minutes of the 2012 Annual Meeting had been approved by the Board at its August 2012 meeting. Brian Rice, Treasurer, presented an oral and written report of Comparative Summary of Accounts as of May 14, 2013.

Glenn L. Rodgers, Councilor for Region III, commented that it was a pleasure to be at this meeting. He stated that our Chapter is considered to be a "flagship" Chapter, that our Chapter is doing the right things, that we need each other to carry on our tradition, and that it is not what we get from our dues but what we can do to carry on the legacy.

Dr. Ralph Kneeream, Dean, thanked all Board Members, Officers, and Committee Chairs for their time and efforts during the past three years. The various items approved by the Executive Board have appeared in The Bombarde. Josephine Freund and David Messner were appointed Auditors for the 2012/2013 Chapter year.

Sub-Dean, Dr. Shawn Gingrich, reported that in the past year he worked to run the programs, and with a committee planned the programs for next season. He also coordinated sales of bequeathed musical instruments left to our Chapter by Patricia Frysinger, who passed away in August of 2012. The net proceeds of the Patricia Frysinger bequest to our Chapter were \$6,200.

Fr. James Lease gave an oral report on the duties he performed as Chaplain of our Chapter during the last year.

Communication Committee Chair, Dr. Shawn Gingrich, reported that the attempt to upgrade our website package did not work satisfactorily so he will revert to the old system for the time being. He also asked that members submit articles of interest to the Chapter for *The Bombarde*.

The report from the Competition Committee was printed in the May, 2013 edition of *The Bombarde*.

A written report was received from Dr. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman, which stated that last year the Education Committee awarded 12 Shenk Scholarships for organ lessons. Vinh Nguyen was given additional money from the Throne Fund to continue his lessons with Dr. Gingrich. Members of our Chapter served lunch and provided extra chaperone help at the LVC Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza event on March 16 of this year. The Education Committee met on May 6 of this year and awarded 14 Shenk scholarships for the summer of 2013.

Kathy Gates, Finance Committee, presented a written Budget for the Chapter for the coming season.

Charles Yocum, Historian, stated that he is going through things since his change of residence; and that he will give Archivist, Ken Walker, boxes of materials.

Karen Appel, Chair of the Hospitality Committee, reported that it was a good year; and that the new Chair of the Committee, Phyllis Conrad, will appreciate continued help and support for the coming season.

Doris Savage, Membership Chair, stated that the monthly Lunch Bunch meetings have increasing numbers of persons attending. The next Lunch Bunch meeting will be June 12 at the Radisson. Doris is also Chair of the Membership Committee and reported that the Chapter has been growing in membership over the past three years. Our Chapter is a finalist in the National Grow the Guild Program.

Dr. Shirley King, Chair of the Nominations Committee, thanked the members of the Committee and commended them for the slate that was presented to the Chapter members for voting. Dr. King also thanked the members of the Chapter for their support.

Tim Koch, Placement, reported that there are four churches that need organists in our area, and that the sub list is up to date.

Rev. Steven Middernacht, Chair of Professional Concerns, stated that the Committee is presently collecting data to update the Salary Guidelines.

Dr. Shawn Gingrich, Chair of the Program Committee, distributed copies of the programs for the coming season. The list is also available on our website.

Mary Jane Nelson, Publicity, stated that most of the programs of our Chapter were designed chiefly for Chapter members and were publicized in The Bombarde and not in other media. *The American Organist* magazine has been faithfully printing all the articles and photos that we send following Chapter programs. Thanks were extended to the on -call photographers Rick Zentmeyer, Roland Freund, Shawn Gingrich, Bob Brommer and Arnold Sten.

There was no New Business presented. Dr. Kneeream, Brian Rice, and Ken Walker were recognized for their past years of service to the Chapter.

Glenn Rodgers installed the new Officers, Board, and Committee Chairs.
