Getting to Know Holly Gainor by Mary Jane Nelson

Currently full-time director of music at Tree of Life Lutheran Church, Holly has been integrated in musical endeavors throughout her life, and has been associated with a number of our Chapter's past and



present members, as you will discover.

Born in Wilkes-Barre, she grew up in Harrisburg in a totally musical household, experiencing piano lessons, sing-alongs, bassoon-playing, music camps, and handbells. Every music teacher with whom she studied was associated in some way with Lebanon Valley, so that's where she went for her college experience. Dr. Robert Lau, at that time, was music department chair. Holly sang in the LVC Concert Choir for four years with the late Dr. Pierce Getz, from whom she learned a tremendous amount about singing.

Holly has taught in the Central Dauphin School District and with the Harrisburg Catholic Diocese, in

addition to having many private piano students. She studied organ with Gerald Hoover, when he was employed at Zion Lutheran, Harrisburg, and pursued graduate studies in educational strategies at Wilkes University.

Holly, now living in Paxtang, has been married to Ray for 24 years, and has three children: Emma (20), David (19) and Noah (16), plus two Jack Russell terriers, Patch and Jessie.

In addition to musical activities, Holly is a certified massage therapist with an interest in alternative health. She continues to implement these skills with family and friends, but music is her full-time choice of occupation. At Tree of Life, she plays an organ, built by Robert Carbaugh, for all services, conducts the adult choir and two handbell choirs, handles all the administrative musical tasks, organizes the children's Sunday School music, develops liturgies with the pastor, oversees the Praise Band director, and builds the master music schedule. To assist her, she has "a small army" of folks who offer their time and talents as soloists or instrumentalists.

It's hard to imagine that Holly has "free time", but she also enjoys puzzles, flower gardening, baking, sewing, and do-it-yourself projects around the house. After all of this, Holly says she likes to "sit still and drink tea!"

Mr. Lane is the winner of many prestigious competitions, including the 2011 Canadian International Organ Competition, and won second prize and audience prize in the 2004 AGO National Young Artist Competition. He is the former Associate University Organist and Choirmaster of Memorial Church at Harvard University and also held assistant organist positions at the Episcopal Church of Trinity-on -the-Green in New Haven and at Saint Thomas Fifth Avenue. He currently serves as the Vice President and Councillor for Competitions and New Music for the American Guild of Organists. Mr. Lane earned his Master of Music degree from the Yale Institute of Sacred Music and his Bachelor of Music degree and Sacred Music Diploma from the Eastman School of Music.

As a soloist, Mr. Lane performs regularly throughout the United States and in Europe. Notable venues include St. Patrick's Cathedral (New York), both St. Paul's Cathedral and Westminster Abbey in London, and Washington National Cathedral. He was a featured performer at the 2013



National Convention of the Royal Canadian College of Organists in Ottawa, the 2005 AGO Region VI Convention in Colorado Springs, and a "Rising Star" performer at the 2002 National AGO Convention in Philadelphia. In 2012, Mr. Lane performed a solo pre-convention recital at the AGO National Convention in Nashville; and in 2014 he performed two featured programs during the AGO National Convention in Boston.

Mr. Lane will be performing music of Bach, Mendelssohn, and Widor, with works of young American composers Carson Cooman and Nico Muhly, on the church's 82-rank Andover organ, which was installed in 2007.
