### March Program “Lau on Lau”

The next Chapter Program will feature our own Robert Lau presenting a session on his organ compositions entitled “Lau on Lau.” We will meet at First United Methodist Church, 64 West Chocolate Avenue, Hershey, on Saturday, March 14, 2015. We’ll gather at 8:30 with some breakfast goodies with the session 9:00-12:00.

Robert Lau holds a Bachelor of Science in Music Education from Lebanon Valley College, a Master of Arts Theory from the Eastman School of Music and a Doctor of Philosophy in Musicology from The Catholic University of America. He has done additional graduate work at Teachers' College of Columbia University, Westminster Choir College and with the late Robert Shaw at the Carnegie Hall Workshops in New York City.

Dr. Lau is Professor Emeritus of Music at Lebanon Valley College where he taught for 22 years, chairing the music department for eleven years. He has been awarded a *Creative Achievement Award* and an *Alumni Citation* from the college. He also served as an Adjunct Professor of Music at Penn State Harrisburg for 20 years.

Theatre Harrisburg has awarded him its *Award for Distinguished Service to the Arts in the Capital Region*.

Robert Lau has more than 400 choral and keyboard works published by the leading music publishing companies in the United States. He has been commissioned to write choral and keyboard works for a variety of churches, individuals and institutions. For his work in published choral and keyboard music he has been awarded 15 Special Awards by ASCAP. He is a frequent guest organist in churches in the Harrisburg area.

Dr. Lau presents workshops and clinics on a variety of topics for churches and organizations throughout the United States. He is a member of the Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), and the American Choral Directors Association. He is the former Music Director of the Harrisburg Choral Society and Former Artistic Director of Jubilate! Choral Ensemble of Gettysburg.

### From the Dean

In this season of Lent I am reminded of an article I read on the richness of Lenten music. Many composers throughout many centuries have created a large amount of music for Lent. Unfortunately for many 21st-century worshippers, the penitential richness of this music has prevented its inclusion due to the frequent rejection of the “suffering Savior” and the “wretched sinner that I am” themes. Our horizontal approach to worship design and the frequent narcissistic “me-centered” song texts and thematic threads have lead us down a different road.

Revisit and include the masters whose works stand the test of time: Palestrina, Tallis, Byrd, Purcell, Bach, and many, many more. One of the huge works, “The Messiah,” which is an Easter Oratorio by Handel (yes Easter, not Christmas), now mostly gets sung for Nativity celebrations. Use “The Hallelujah Chorus” as a resurrection celebration as it was intended.

I am happy to report that Ralph Kneeream has been appointed to the board as chair of Professional Development. There has been a good bit of work from the national committee on this front so stay tuned for more information.

## Archivist Report for the 1953/1954 Season

The following is from a letter sent to the members of the Chapter from the Dean, Robert S. Clippinger.

“A series of CHOIR LOFT MUTUAL ASSISTANCE MEETINGS is planned for the season. These are for the purpose of getting to know each other better and for the purpose of exchanging ideas and experiences. We shall also learn to know the various churches and organists of the area. We shall meet on a Saturday evening each month at five-thirty at an eating place near the church to which we shall adjourn, where the organist and host will play the next day's pieces and explain the service. The first one is planned for October—exact date to be announced later—at which time we plan to meet at the Linden Tree Tea Room, and then adjourn to the Cathedral Church of St. Stephen, where Mr. Gordon Breary will be our host. The meetings are to be over by eight, and no one shall exert more than his usual weekend preparation for them. In that way the standard shall not become too high, also we'd be nervous when performing. The primary purpose is fellowship!”

## Music Scholarship Opportunities Offered

The Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) is pleased to invite piano students from 13 to 18 years of age to apply for the Yocum Pipe Organ Encounter Scholarships to be offered during the summer of 2015. Highlights of her 2014 solo recitals were performances at Trinity Church on Copley Square, Boston, MA; Adolphus Busch Hall, Harvard University; St. Thomas Church in New York City; the Cunerakerk in Rhenen, Netherlands; and the Salzburger Dom, Salzburg, Austria. Karen made her organ performance debut at age 7 on Christmas Eve, 2002 at historic Christ Church in Philadelphia. At age 10 she performed on the Aeolian-Skinner organ at First Lutheran Church as part of a Young Peoples Concert for *Fine Arts at First*. The artist series is pleased to welcome Karen Christianson's return to First Lutheran. Admission to the concert is free. A freewill offering will be received to benefit the work of Carlisle's Safe Harbour, a non-profit organization whose mission is to provide shelter for the homeless.
