



UPDATE on Nominations

As many of you know there has been a snag in our election plans. Our chapter procedures require the slate of nominations to be recorded and communicated to the chapter by March I followed by a 30-day period for receipt of additional nominations. We did this and then learned in early April that Aaron Sunstein, nominated to SubDean, would be resigning his position and leaving the area in July. In light of this situation the Dean asked the board to set aside the rules of the procedures so that we could alter the slate of nominations before voting began. Since the Dean would be called upon to make appointments for vacancies he took the liberty to contact Brett Terry (Pine Street Presbyterian, Harrisburg) to ask him to serve as SubDean. Brett has agreed to do that. Since Brett was already on the slate as an at-large member, his seat would be vacated, so the Dean contacted one of the names on the Nominating Committee's list of potential candidates, Robert Barbarino (St. Patrick Cathedral, Harrisburg) to ask him to serve as a member at-large. He has agreed to do that.

On April 9 in an action made through an email vote, the board voted to set aside the Chapter Procedures' guidelines on elections this year and reannounce the slate of nominations with the substitutions of Brett Terry for SubDean and Robert Barbarino for an at-large seat. That gives us the following slate who will be installed at the May 10 Annual Meeting.

It was decided to hold the monthly meetings at 8:00 p.m.

A Regional Convention was held in Lancaster in June. The price of the Forum organ was raised from \$137,000 to \$193,000 due to the cost of necessary alterations to the building.
