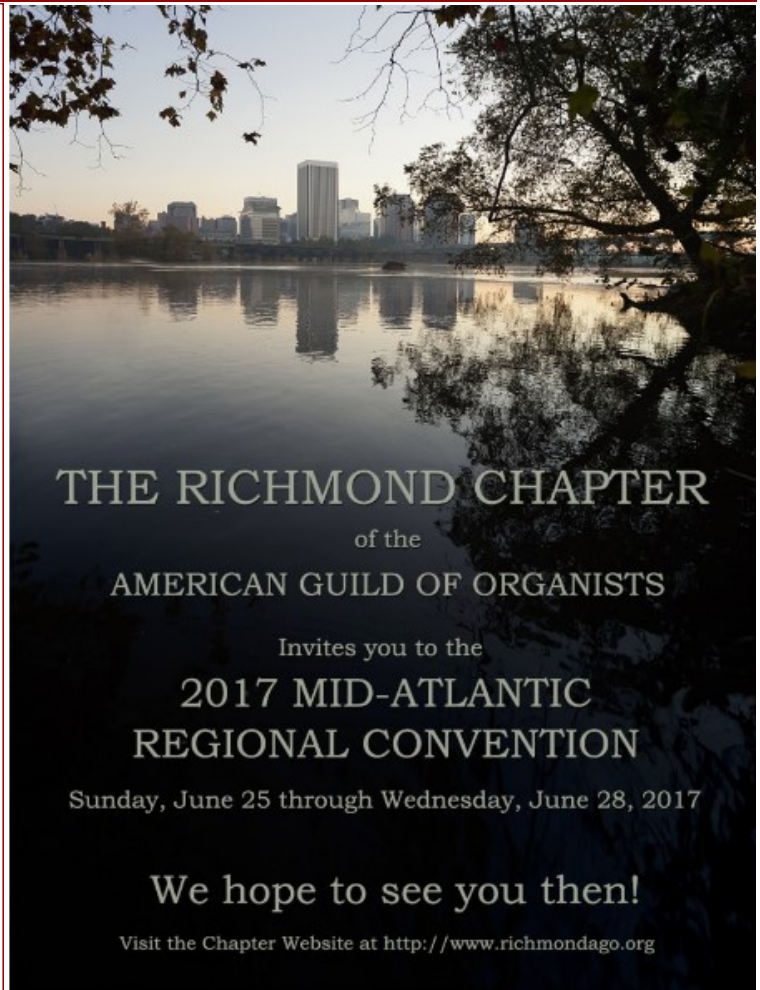

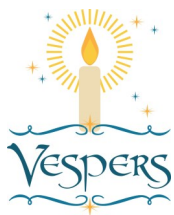

“An Alpine Christmas” Concert at Derry Church Showcases Choirs, Bells, Orchestra and Guest Soloists

“An Alpine Christmas” holiday concert extravaganza will bring together adult, youth and children’s choirs, handbells, orchestra and guest soloists at 4pm Sunday, December 11 in the sanctuary at Derry Presbyterian Church, 248 East Derry Road, Hershey.

The concert is part of the church’s 2016-17 Arts Alive Cultural Series. A free-will offering will be received. Handicapped parking and an elevator are available. Doors will open at 3:15 pm. Early arrival is recommended as seating is limited. Overflow seating will be provided on the lower level with a private showing via Derry Church’s live streaming capabilities.
