## **Lunch Bunch—New Location**



Robert Lau's latest organ collection, Music from the Psalms, has been published by the Lorenz Corporation. All original compositions, the works are preludes, offertories and postludes based on musical reflections of various psalms and psalm passages.

The Psalms served as the first songbook of the church, and this Robert Lau collection draws inspiration from these verses of comfort and enlightenment to create a set of works. original



While each piece in the collection can supplement any service or recital, they are designed to form two three-movement "Psalm Sonatas" (each comprised of a prelude, offertory, and postlude) and a standalone contemplation inspired by Psalm 121.

Items discussed at Board meetings were:

A decision not to take part in this year's Arts Festival—it was noted that this decision was made based on the "Fiasco" of last year!

Carolyn Evens and Doris Studer presented several recommendations for the substitute and job placement guidelines.

Pierce Getz spoke on organist/clergy relations followed by a lengthy and lively discussion.

Dorothy Lee and Pierce Getz were appointed to co-ordinate the Cassell Scholarship.

Cassell Scholarship Competition was held at Pine Street Presbyterian on February 12.

The Board voted to amend the Salary Guidelines with a 10 per cent increase in compensations.

The September meeting was a slide presentation of historic organs by Pierce Getz.

A November meeting of the Chapter was an organ/brass program.

It was decided that the Chapter would not join the Harrisburg Art Association.

David Binkley reported that he had talked to Mary Lou Herrick, Region III Chairman, regarding the Chapter sponsoring the Regional Convention in 1985 or 1987.

Liz Stingley chaired the Nominating Committee.

A Choir Festival was held at Lakeside Lutheran on February 13.

Report in our packet recaps 13 Shenk scholarship recipients who played at the student recital in August.

## Finance:

To prepare budget for 2017 Kathy Gates needs a board member to join the Dean, Finance chair, Sub-Dean and Treasurer and needs committee chairs to set forth approximate costs for the coming year.

## **Hospitality:**

Phyllis expressed that she needs someone to take charge of the November program refreshments because she has a conflict that evening. Carolyn Wright volunteered to help. Ray Edmison also agreed to cover the event.

## **Information Technology:**

Dean suggested that we need a more impressive website and asked anyone who would be willing to work on this project to speak with him.

## Membership/Registrar:

Membership is holding steady at 134 members – 15 are students.

## **Unfinished Business:**

Reported two requests were made via e-mail:

- (I) appoint Dan Dorty as Chair of Competitions and Justin Myers as Chapter Historian.
- (2) appoint Judy Schrack as Chair of Membership and Chris Prestia as Chair of Professional Development.
- Both requests were approved via email.
- Ken Walker should be given a copy of the Auditor's Report to add to the archives. Auditors Brian Rice and David Messner signed the audit report. Moved by Mary Jane Nelson and seconded by Kathy Gates that the report be accepted with the addition of \$300 as the Dean's discretionary fund. Voice vote by Board approved this action.

#### **New Business:**

Dean expressed concern that the Bishop fund is only earning 1%. He contacted David Furniss, Philadelphia Chapter, who advised to invest conservatively. They generally get 4-6% on American funds in Chicago. Tony Thurman, Development for the National guild concurred we should be more aggressive than holding money in a CD to get a better return.

- It was suggested a 10 year committee be formed, with the Board appointing a new person to the committee every two years. Each person would serve a 10 year term. The person serving the last two years would serve as chair.
- Moved by Tom Notestine that we pursue and investigate putting an endowment committee together to explore possibilities for the Bishop fund. Dr. Lau seconded the motion.
- A committee will be established by the February board meeting.
- Kathy Gates and Brett Terry volunteered to serve on the committee.
- Phyllis Conrad reinforced our discussion of diversifying the Bishop funds by stating we should take a clue from how the Bishop funds her estate, were invested. It is our understanding that the estate was diversified.

The Dean read a thank you note from Marty and Jill Yocum, addressed to the Guild, for participating in Charles Yocum's funeral service.

The Dean noted that our February meeting falls on Valentine's Day. It was agreed to move the date to February 21, 2017.

**Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
