

Archivist Report

1983 / 1984 Season

The Executive Board met September 13, 1983, at Trinity Lutheran Church in Lemoyne prior to the recital by James Darling. James Bordner resigned from the Board because he was moving to Texas. Treasurer, Bill Burnette, reported the Chapter had 88 paid members. Tom Hughes was received into membership at this meeting, and Barbara Bressler was reinstated as a member.

The Board met on November 29, 1983, at the home of David Binkley. Treasurer, Bill Burnette, reported a checking account balance of \$1,210.17; State Capital Certificate of \$6.000; Harris Savings Passbook balance of \$1,159.93. Eleanor Boyer will serve as chair of the Nominating Committee as well as Faith Matthews and three nonboard members of the Chapter. Waneta Benson was named to fill the seat on the Board vacated by lames Bordner. Doris Studer organized the April 10, 1984, Chapter meeting in the New Kingston churches. Mansfield University Choir in Hershey



The Mansfield University Concert Choir, a select ensemble of singers representing some of the finest talent from the American Northeast, will perform for the Arts Alive Cultural Series at 4 pm Sunday, April 2 in the Sanctuary at Derry Presbyterian Church, 248 East Derry Road, Hershey.

A free will offering will be received. Handicapped parking and an elevator are available.

As the university's premier touring ensemble, the Mansfield University Concert Choir has been invited for 20 consecutive years to perform at state, regional, national, or international choral conventions and has won nine gold medals and numerous prizes in international competitions. For their Arts Alive concert appearance, the choir will sing selections including *Danny Boy, Shenandoah, Sit Down Servant, Precious Lord* and *Unclouded Day*.

While the majority of the singers are undergraduate music majors, membership is open to all students at the university through an audition process. The Concert Choir has performed in 16 countries during their seven European tours, and the group has produced 20 CD recordings on the Mark Custom Recording Label. The singers are frequently praised for the emotional spectrum in their performances, their diverse vocal color, and their varied repertoire.

Peggy Dettwiler, Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Mansfield University, conducts the Concert Choir, Festival Chorus, and Chamber Singers, and teaches choral conducting and methods. She holds the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. She also has a Master of Music Degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Texas at San Antonio and a Master of Music Degree in Music Education from the University of Wisconsin in Madison. In 2010, Dr. Dettwiler received the Elaine Brown Award for Choral Excellence from the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association, and she placed second in 2011 and 2013 for the American Prize for Choral Conductors at the College/University level. Dettwiler made her conducting debut in Carnegie Hall in January 2014 and presented an interest session at the World Choral Symposium in Seoul, Korea, in August 2014. Dettwiler received the Presidential Coin for Excellence from General Francis Hendricks, President of Mansfield University and was designated "2015 Honored Artist of the American Prize." In 2016, she served on the jury for the World Choir Games in Sochi, Russia. In January 2017, Dettwiler served as Artistic Director for the concert, "Of War, Peace, and the Power of Music," held in Carnegie Hall and sponsored by Performing Arts Educators.

The Chapter did not pursue sponsoring a regional convention since other chapters are interested in the 1987 and 1989 events.

On January 18, 1984, the Board met at Zion Lutheran Church in Harrisburg. The following nominations were presented by Eleanor Boyer for the next season:

A Program Committee was formed consisting of Faith Matthews, Barbara Carpenter, Ken Walker, and three non-Board Members—not named in the minutes of this meeting.

- A celebration for the 50th anniversary of the Chapter
- Bach/Handel 300th anniversary
- Chambersburg Theatre organ and Moller Factory in Hagerstown
- Clergy/organist meeting
- Wedding music program

An \$80 ad was placed in the 1985 Charlestown, West Virginia, Regional Program.

Dorothy Lee was named to co-ordinate the Cassell Scholarship for the next year. The required piece was Franck's "A Minor Choral", the part beginning with the reed solo and playing through to the end. Zion Lutheran, 4th Street in Harrisburg, was asked to host the Scholarship Competition and a meeting of the Chapter shortly after the competition.

Sue Klinedinst and Bill Hemminger suggested that the Professional Concerns Committee revise the figures in the Salary Guidelines and then make the new figures available to the membership of the Chapter.

This part is not difficult to apprehend:

As Beth Walker and Sally Rankin were moving, there were two vacancies on the Board

- The Dean asked several members to finish out the terms of these persons for the remainder of this season
- In addition, Barbara Carpenter moved to Sub Dean; and Ken Walker moved to Secretary
- Since there were five nominees for the Board of Directors and only three would be elected, two persons will be asked to join the Board for the 1984/1987 seasons to fill the open slots on the Board.

There was discussion on the missing scrapbooks and other materials including Secretary minutes of meetings. Could this be the start of the "search" for these items?

Edgington Celebration Concert at Trinity, New Cumberland

Monte Maxwell in Hanover



Monte Maxwell, Chapel Organist, Director of Chapel Music and the Midshipmen Symphony Orchestra, began his service at the United States Naval Academy in 1997. Mr. Maxwell, a native of San Angelo, Texas, earned his Bachelor of Music Degree from Texas Christian University, Fort Worth, studying with Emmet G. Smith. He was then invited to study at the Curtis Institute of Music with John Weaver where he received an Artist Diploma, Curtis' highest degree. Mr. Maxwell earned his Master of Music Degree



from the Juilliard School of Music in New York City, also studying with John Weaver. While studying in Philadelphia, Mr. Maxwell was an Associate Organist at the John Wanamaker Store, playing the famed six-manual organ, the largest playing organ in the world.

At the Naval Academy, Mr. Maxwell serves as the principal organist for the Protestant and Catholic services as well as playing for weddings, memorial services, funerals and performances throughout the year. He commands the five -manual, 268-rank organ in the main chapel, which has recently undergone substantial enhancement under his direction and design. His additional responsibilities include working with the Protestant and Catholic Chapel Choirs, the

Protestant Chapel Chorale, the Men's and Women's Glee Clubs, and conducting the annual winter musical theater productions as well as the Naval Academy Midshipmen Symphony Orchestra. He oversees the annual Chapel Organ Concert series which features guest performing artists from across the United States. He has also served as the Chairman of the Naval Academy Music Department and Director of Instrumental Activities.

Mr. Maxwell's annual All Saints' Day Organ Concert has become a staple of the Naval Academy and greater Annapolis cultural community. The standing-room-only event drew some 3,000 people into the Naval Academy Chapel in 1998, breaking all records in attendance for any event throughout the Chapel's history. Due to the popularity of this event, the Academy now offers two ticketed performances of this concert each year. He has performed in the United States, South America, Eastern and Western Europe, and Canada, and is an active member of the American Guild of Organists.

The St. Matthew Lutheran Church Austin organ is one of the 10 largest pipe organs in the world with 14,470 pipes, 238 stops and 335 drawknobs. A full stop list and description of the organ can be found on the church website- <u>stmatlutheran.org</u>.

Road Trip?

Chris Prestia will be playing a recital at St. Stephen's Pro-Cathedral in Wilkes-Barre on April 12 at noon. The program is the church's closing Lenten recital followed by Eucharist. The all-English program will include Frank Bridge, Thomas Tomkins, and Herbert Howells. The organ is a 4-manual, 89-rank, 5,003-pipe instrument built by Bergaus in 2002 which incorporates the work of Austin (1905), Aeolian-Skinner (1954), and later, Allan Van Zoeren. Berghaus rebuilt the organ so that the "new" instrument successfully assimilated the disparate tonal qualities of the previous builders.
