

The concert will feature original works and arrangements of hymns, classic tunes, and other favorite melodies. Two selections will feature the addition of organ.



Christie Plays in Baltimore


The Tiffany Series is thrilled to announce a recital by James David Christie, internationaally acclaimed as one of the great organists of our time, on Sunday, May 7, 2017 at 3 p.m. at Brown Memorial Presbyterian Church, 1320 Park Avenue (Bolton Hill), Baltimore. He will be playing the church's 1930 Skinner Organ, Opus 839, IV/45. A reception will follow.

Christie will play a colorful and varied program of primarily French works. Composers include J. Guy Ropartz, Augustine Barié, Henri



Christie is Professor of Organ at the Oberlin College Conservatory, Distinguished Artist in Residence at the College of the Holy Cross, and College Organist at Wellesley College. He also serves as organist of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, a position he has held since 1978. He has presented over 60 tours of Europe and has performed and recorded with major orchestras around the world. He has been the featured artist at the AGO national convention six times, most recently in 2014 in Boston. In the fall of 2010, Christie exchanged positions with Notre Dame Cathedral titular organist Olivier Latry, and also served as visiting Professor of Organ at the Paris Conservatory.

Tickets are \$20 (students \$10). We also offer Patron tickets for \$50 to help support the Series. Patrons receive a CD of either "Celebrate the Skinner," a Tiffany Series concert featuring organists John Walker, Marvin Mills, Michael Britt and

** Savings Interest will be kept in new Asset Account "Reserve Savings Interest", and will be split up among the other funds at the end of the fiscal year (June 2017). This will allow us to share the income with all named funds, but not have to do the split every month.

There was a typo in the Frances Bishop figure for 3/1/2017 in the last newsletter. It was shown as \$129,681.39 but the actual was \$128,681.39. Also, we have found out that due to receipt of \$126,000 last June, we were required to register with PA Bureau of Charitable Organizations (BCO) by 7/21/2016. We have taken care of this registration and paid the registration fee of \$150 along with late fees of \$225. The Board approved paying this from the Bishop Fund in a recent email vote.

Archivist Report

1984 / 1985 Season

A special thanks to Stephen Shoop, Minister of Music and Organist at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Lebanon, for donating materials from our Chapter's past to the Archives.

This season began the 49th year of our Chapter, and events were planned for November of 1985 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of our founding.

The Board of the Harrisburg Chapter AGO met at dinner on September 11, 1984, at St. Patrick's Cathedral in Harrisburg. Approval was given for the payment of telephone charges for Faith Matthews and Waneta Benson. Faith Matthews reported that Waneta Benson had informed her that a CD was earning more interest than we expected, and Waneta suggested that the extra interest be used to purchase another CD which will earn more interest than putting the monies into a passbook savings. It was approved by the Board that \$1,000 be put into a 6-month CD with Harris Savings.

Doris Studer asked for suggestions as to how she could ascertain if persons requesting to use our placement service were members of the Guild. It was discussed, and the following decisions were made: a post card was to be sent each fall to persons asking if they wished to remain on our list, a membership application will be sent to non-members, a fee of \$50 will be charged to non-members for using this service.

On October 6, 1984, the Board met at the Camp Hill Presbyterian Church prior to the Marilyn Mason workshop. Chuck Yocum reported that the Treasurer's books would be audited soon. Payment for monthly meeting dinners was discussed, and it was decided that monies would be sent to the host church.

Salary Guidelines needed to be updated from 1980. Faith Matthews, Gerry Hoover and Purnell Payne began this updating process. Sue Klinedinst was contacted about past work she had done on the Guidelines.

Barbara Carpenter reported that Capitol Trailways would provide a bus for the November 10 trip to Moller Organ Company in Hagerstown and Virginia organs. Cost was \$10 per person for the bus and \$6 for lunch. The new Directory was being compiled by Sue Klinedinst. It was discovered that there was a need for one more Board member since last May's realignment. Josephine Freund filled this vacancy.

There was a Board meeting on December 5, 1984, at Calvary United Methodist Church in Lemoyne. Membership cards were obtained from National, and each member of the Chapter received a card for the 1984/1985 season.

It was announced by Barbara Carpenter that the Moller Organ Company had paid for the lunches for the November 10 organ crawl for the members of our Chapter. It was decided to donate the \$150 to the Development Fund of the AGO.

Faith Matthews distributed "Salary Guidelines For Church Musicians" from the committee working on the new guidelines. Doris Studer, Chair of the Substitute and Placement Committee, was given copies for distribution to persons and groups inquiring about the hiring of a church musician. Chaplain William Kauffman was given permission to purchase cards to be sent to ill and hospitalized members of the Chapter as needed. Dean Matthews served refresh-

ments after the meeting!

There was a meeting of the Board on May 8, 1985, at Calvary United Methodist Church. Treasurer Freund was asked to call National Headquarters to assure that the \$150, monies from the luncheon on the organ crawl in November, were sent to the Development Fund or the Annual Fund. If these were two different funds, the Treasurer was given permission to send \$150 for the Annual Fund to correct the error.

Dean Matthews introduced Ellen Arnold, Executive Director of Allied Arts Fund, who presented information on the fund and offered membership to our Chapter. Treasurer Freund was instructed to send \$40 checks to each of the persons who were willing to be judges in the Cassell Scholarship Competition even though there was no competition this year. Dorothy Lee agreed to be in charge of the competition for the next year.

A discussion on the amount of dues for the 85/86 year was held. National dues were \$20, and it was agreed to collect \$17 for our local Chapter.

Barbara Carpenter, Program Chair, reported on the up-coming 50th Anniversary meeting. Eight Charter Members accepted the invitation to attend. David Binkley and Gerry Hoover contacted former Deans, and a telephone committee was set up to contact each member of the Chapter regarding the May 21 dinner and November 10 Festival Vesper Service. No details of the dinner were found, and the Festival Vespers Service will be reported in the article for the 1985/1986 season.

Ken Walker and Gerry Hoover will represented our Chapter on June 9 at the York Chapter's 50th Anniversary Service.

After speaking with Sue Klinedinst at a recent Chapter meeting, I learned that a newspaper clipping announcing a program she presented at a meeting was probably during this time period.

Suzanne Klinedinst will present a program at a meeting of the Harrisburg Chapter of American Guild of Organists on Tuesday (no date) in Mechanicsburg Presbyterian Church. Klinedinst, the church's director of music, will present a lecture/demonstration on "Articulation and Ornamentation in the Chorale Preludes from Johann Sebastian Bach's "Orgelbuchlein".

The Chapter prepared a brochure "Guidelines for Compensation of Church

Musicians", which is available at no cost to area musicians and church officers. The brochure includes suggested fees for weddings, funerals and substitute musicians, salaries for full-time positions and a chart for calculating salaries for part-time musicians. A copy of this brochure could be obtained by sending a stamped, self-addressed envelope to David H. Binkley, Camp Hill Presbyterian Church, 101 N. 23rd St., Camp Hill 17011.

The Board met on June 5, 1985, at Calvary United Methodist Church. Mary Ann Nelson was introduced as a new Board member. Member Lee reported that the date of June 7, 1986, was satisfactory for the Cassell Student Competition at Zion Lutheran Church in Harrisburg. The amount of the prize for the competition was raised to \$600 for the 1986 competition. Dues for the next season were set at \$37 for voting member, \$22 for special voting member, \$12 for dual membership, and \$20 for subscribing membership.

Members Carpenter, Hoover, Freund and Walker met on June 12 to prepare a program schedule to be submitted to the Board for the 1985/1986 season.


Auditors Walsh and Yocum reported that the books were audited and approved.

"BIG" Organ News

The Wanamaker Organ will be getting a new stop, its curator announced today. Macy's will be acquiring the (in)famous "Terz-zimbel" stop from Washington National Cathedral, which has declared it redundant because of numerous hearing-loss claims, and installing it in the 6-manual Wanamaker Organ.

"The Terz-zimbel, along with our existing Baroque stops like the Clear Flute, French Trumpet, and double-languid Dia-pason, will make possible the proper registration of gentle Bach organ works like the chorale preludes. More importantly, it will make use of the presently unused stop tab in the 'Choir Division' that console visitors keep pestering me about" said Murt Cangel, Curator.

Future additions awaiting funding include a "chorus of throbbing Tibias," a "division of piquant baroque reeds," a "toy counter" ("The small theatre organ upstairs has one, and our staff organists want

one in the Wanamaker Organ too") and a "dozen or so more violin stops" ("The Wanamaker Organ is, sadly, deficient in string-tone") according to Cangel.

The Historic Organs Restoration Committee (HORC) is proud to announce to-day that a contract has been issued to Pary S. Ghillips to add an eighth manual (61 -note compass) to the Boardwalk Hall organ. It will be the home manual for the "Brass Chorus" division, when it is made playable, and a few stop tabs from unused "swell shade couplers" will be assigned to sub/super/unison off functions for the eighth manual. "We deeply regret that it isn't possible to add enough stops to couple the other 21 divisions to the new eighth manual at every possible pitch, but at all costs we want to keep the stop jambs unaltered," said the HORC in a statement. "We think that 1,250 stop tabs are enough."
