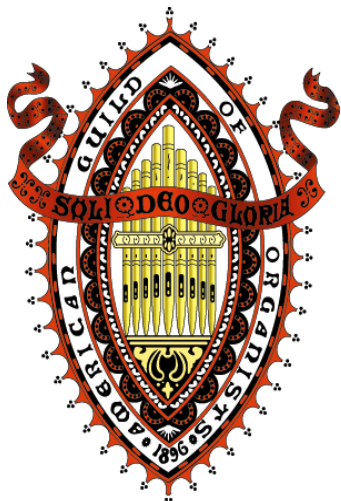

Archivist Report—1985 / 1986 Season

This season marked the 50th anniversary of our Chapter. In addition to regular meetings there were two special events. On May 20, 1985, there was an Anniversary Banquet held at Casa Rillo, Camp Hill. Charter Members of our Chapter were honored at this event. There are pictures of the event in the Archives with identification of the persons pictured.

Another event in celebration of our 50th anniversary was a Festival Vesper Service held at Zion Lutheran Church in Harrisburg on November 10. The Preludes were played by Brian Rice and David Binkley. Brian played “Carillon” by Leo Sowerby; and David played “Fantasia in G (BWV572) by Johann Sebastian Bach. The Psalmody was Heinrich Schutz “Psalm 98” sung by the Master Singers Guild, Herbert O. Fowler, Director. The Sermon was delivered by The Rev. William B. Kauffman, Pastor, Saint Paul Lutheran Church, Harrisburg. Pierce Getz, Director of Music, Annville United Methodist Church and Faculty, Lebanon Valley College, was the choir director for the anthem, “Jesu, Joy of Man’s Desiring” by Johann Sebastian Bach. Following the Festival Vesper Service there was a reception.

In January of 1985 there was a meeting at Grace United Methodist Church, Harrisburg, with Ron Sider as host. The program featured organ works of J. S. Bach. Members playing in the recital were Esther Long, Charles Yocum, Elaine Dent, Gerald Hoover, David Binkley, Faith Matthews and Ross Ellison. Guests soloists were Steven Strauss and Raydel Goldsboro.

The February 19 program at Zion Lutheran Church, Harrisburg, featured a new film entitled “In Search of Bach” followed by an anthem reading sessions led by Chapter members.

There were no applicants for the Cassell Scholarship for this year.

The March 12 meeting was held at Salem UCC, Chestnut Street, Harrisburg. There was no dinner served at this meeting; however, there was coffee and dessert following the meeting! There was a member recital featuring the music of Handel, Schutz, and Scarlatti. No names were given for the organists. There was also an anthem reading session led by Liz Stingley, Chuck Yocum, and David Binkley.

A program centered on wedding music was held in April at St. Paul’s Lutheran Church, Carlisle. The first portion of the meeting was presented by Chaplain, Rev. Bill Kauffman and was titled “Pastoral Perspective”. Chuck Yocum presented the “Organist’s Prospective”, which included music for the processional and recessional. There was also a compiled list of wedding music sent by members of the Chapter and handed out at the meeting.

On April 20 at Camp Hill Presbyterian Church Helen Kemp presented a Children’s Choir Workshop with a Festival Rehearsal at 9:30 a.m. The Children’s Choir Festival was held on April 21 at Good Shepherd Catholic Church, Camp Hill, and featured 275 children from 18 Harrisburg Churches.

In January of 1986 there was a Chapter meeting at Trinity Lutheran Church in Camp Hill. Dinner was at 6:30 with the meeting and program beginning at 7:30. Ann Labounsky, of Dusquene University, spoke on Guild Exams and Improvisation.



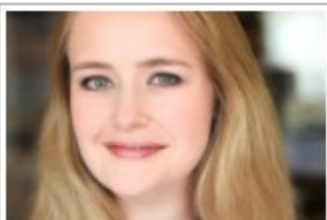

Tim Zimmerman and The King's Brass present classics, patriotic selections and hymn classics with a contemporary flair. The King's Brass features three trumpets, three trombones, a tuba, percussion and keyboards. These instruments blend together to create an innovative musical



experience that will be enjoyed by all generations. Karen Buckwalter will accompany the King's Brass in a number of selections and will play several organ solos on St. Matthew's 14,470-pipe Austin organ which has recently undergone a 5 year renovation.

The King's Brass, formed three decades ago, is comprised of professional musicians from across the country, who desire to use the instruments they love to lead others in praise, worship and offer the extraordinary concerts.
