On Saturday, September 21, 2019, a Liturgical and Improvisation Workshop and Masterclass will be given by Mr. Robert McCormick. This event will be held at First Evangelical Lutheran Church (FELC) located at 21 S. Bedford St. Carlisle, PA 17013. The doors will open at 9:30 a.m. for a coffee gathering, followed by the workshop at 10:00.

FELC is a landmark of Carlisle enriched with history and fine music in both worship and concert setting. Under the Musical Worship direction of David Erickson, FELC is home to three vocal choirs, handbell choir, and an active concert series, Fine Arts at First. It is the perfect musical and spiritual setting for this exciting event.



A graduate of Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ, Mr. McCormick is widely recognized as one of the finest organists and church musicians of this era. As a consummate improviser and master of technique, Mr. McCormick has given recitals and performed in concerts all across the United States.

In addition, Mr. McCormick has been a featured artist and clinician at numerous conventions and conferences held by the AGO, The Association of Anglican Musicians, and the Royal School of Church Music in

America playing recitals, worship services, and presenting workshops on church music and choral training.

Choir and Organ reviewed an album featuring his choir, and organ virtuosity, from St. Paul's K Street in Washington DC, released by the Pro Organo, and hailed his choir as "one of the most responsive and adaptable choirs on the eastern seaboard." and further stated that "McCormick shines at the organ!"

After eight years in that role, and a previous seven years as Organist and Music Director at The Church of St. Mary the Virgin, in New York City, Mr. McCormick currently serves as Organist and Choir Master at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Philadelphia.
