Organ Crawl of Downtown Harrisburg — Saturday, November 16, 2019

Are you an organist who'd like the chance to see and experience other instruments in your community? Or, perhaps you're someone who has always been curious about these grand instruments and never had the opportunity to learn more. Or, maybe you've always wanted to learn to play the organ and would love to meet the right people who would be more than willing to answer any of your questions. Well, The Historic Harrisburg Association and the Harrisburg Chapter American Guild of Organists invite you to attend an 'Organ Crawl' of Downtown Harrisburg. This is a fun and unique event showcasing some incredible pipe organs, and the beautiful churches that house them.

On the morning of November 16, seven downtown churches will open their doors, choir lofts, and organ consoles to visitors who would like to see, hear, and even play these unique instruments. You may casually tour these locations on your own, or for a more structured morning, you may choose to follow the schedule. The schedule begins with an introduction to the organ, then cycles through all seven churches with a 10-minute organ demonstration at each of the following locations.

Hymn Festival

On the evening of Friday, October 4th, Dr. Robert Lau and the Harrisburg Chapter AGO hosted a wonderfully informative and peacefully musical hymn festival which took us on a journey through the liturgical year. The festival took place at Camp Hill Presbyterian Church in Camp Hill, PA. The beautiful sanctuary houses a magnificent Shantz Pipe Organ which makes a bold statement in the room to both glorify and symbolize God's presence. Mr. Dan Dorty is the Director of Music for this active congregation, and was proud to help host such an event. Each hymn was carefully picked and arranged by Dr. Lau with full explanation and historical detail throughout. To be witness to a roomful of unified followers singing the words of encouragement that only a hymn can provide is truly an experience to behold. It was a beautiful evening filled with voice, song, pipe organ, and brass.

Fine Arts at First

Thomas Gaynor, New Zealand-born organist, will perform in concert at First Evangelical Lutheran Church, 21 S. Bedford St., Carlisle on Sunday, November 17 at 3:00 p.m. In 2017, he was awarded the First Prize in Organ interpretation as well as the Audience Prize at the St. Albans International Organ Competition - the 25th organist and the second



New Zealander to receive this distinction since the competition and festival was founded in 1963. He is rapidly making his mark on the organ scene in both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres with rock-solid playing and remarkable musical élan. Mr. Gaynor is a doctoral candidate at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, and a recipient of Eastman's highly coveted Artist Certificate, an honor the institution had not given an organist for nearly three decades. The recital will feature something for everyone and will showcase the majesty and versatility of the church's 1951 Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ, regarded as one of the finest instruments in South Central Pennsylvania. The concert will be held as a benefit for The Arc of Cumberland and Perry Counties (CPARC). Based in Carlisle, its mission is to provide support, training, and opportunities to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. The concert is free. All proceeds raised will be donated to support The Arc's programs. A dessert reception will be held following the performance.
