David Binkley was honored by the Camp Hill Presbyterian Church on his 30th anniversary as Organist/Choirmaster. A commissioned anthem by Robert Lau entitled "Rejoice, the Lord is King" was premiered at the Sunday service on June 29.

The Yocum Scholarship was established on June 8 when Chuck Yocum was presented with a check for \$2,500 from our Chapter and friends. The Yocum Scholarship is designated to assist in the ongoing development of the POE program.

Chapter member Carl Schroeder was ordained into the ministry of the Anglican Catholic Church in September.
