The Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) presents concert organist Michael Hey of New York City on the four-manual, 83-rank Aeolian-Skinner / M.P. Möller organ at Pine Street Presbyterian Church, 310 N Third Street, Harrisburg, at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 22. This event is open to the public and is free, though donations will be gratefully received.



Hey will play works of Bach and Sowerby, among others, and an exciting new composition by Jason Roberts.

Described as "flashy" and "exciting" (The American Organist), Hey has been increasingly visible on U.S. and international concert stages. Michael has performed solo organ recitals at Lincoln Center (New York), the Kimmel Center (Philadelphia), the Kennedy Center (Washington D.C.) and Davies Hall (San Francisco).

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Michael graduated in 2014 from The Juilliard School, where he received both his Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees in organ performance under Paul Jacobs.

Within one year of his graduation, he was appointed Associate Director of Music and Organist of St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, where one of his first major tasks was to play organ for Vespers and Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral and Madison Square Garden for the first U.S. visit of Pope Francis.

In September 2017, Michael received first prize in the First Shanghai Conservatory of Music International Organ Competition. In 2019, he performed solo recitals for the New York City Chapter of the AGO and two regional conventions for the American Guild of Organists.

- The Twelfth Night Celebration scheduled for January was cancelled.
- At a Board meeting in December 2009 Dr. Shirley King, Convention Coordinator, gave an oral report on the progress of the planning for the 2011 Regional Convention to be hosted by our Chapter. At a later Board meeting Dr. King presented a written report on the proposed plans for the Regional Convention. All information given in the written report was not for publication at that time.
- Dr. Shirley King put together a Steering Committee
 for the Regional Convention. The Chairs of
 committees met on a monthly basis to discuss
 performance locations, programs, artists, restaurant
 suggestions and much more. The Program
 Committee chaired by Thomas Clark-Jones was busy
 setting up venues that would include some of the
 best locations in the Harrisburg/Hershey/York areas.
 David Hoffman chaired the Gifts/Grants Committee
 and contacted potential supporters/donors. The
 Hilton on Market Square in Harrisburg was chosen
 as Convention Headquarters.
- Dr. Robert Lau presented the program "Easy Improvisation for the Church Organist" in February 2010 at Zion Lutheran Church in Harrisburg. This presentation consisted of a graduated process in which written hymns are embellished initially for accompaniment to singing. Additional improvisatory techniques were examined to demonstrate further refinement resulting in works which could be used as preludes, offertories and/or pieces to be played during communion.
- The National Convention of the American Guild of Organists was held in Washington, D.C. July 4 through 8, 2010.

Winner of both the First and Audience Prizes at the 2017 Albert Schweitzer Organ Competition, Grant has appeared at the 2017 OHS Convention, and as a semifinalist in the 2019 Longwood International Organ Competition. He currently serves as the Organist and Director of Music Ministries at Derry Presbyterian Church in Hershey, Pennsylvania, the new home of Aeolian-Skinner Op. 1132, originally installed in 1950 at Church of the Redeemer in New Haven, CT.

Rick Zentmeyer is a Navy veteran, attended Lebanon Valley College, and later graduated from the University of Toledo, OH with an Electrical Engineering degree. He worked in West Springfield, MA before moving to Hershey in 1993. Prior to learning classical organ, Rick enjoyed playing Theatre Organ style. He became a church organist after many years of private lessons when living in Westfield, having studied with Lynn Edwards



and later with Allan Taylor. In Hershey he studied with Helen Anthony at Derry Presbyterian Church for several years before final organ studies at Lebanon Valley College, completing a two-year evening course, with studies from Suzanne Riehl and Dr. Pierce Getz. After doing a few years of substitute work Rick then became Organist/Choir Director at Faith UCC in Grantville, where he has been for 20 years. Rick has served on the Harrisburg AGO board in the past, has held the office of treasurer, and was on the 2011 Regional Convention Committee.

Shenk Scholarship

The Harrisburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) invites students in grades 4 to 12 to apply for the Violette I. Shenk Scholarship. The scholarship provides the equivalent of ten 30-minute organ lessons with qualified members of the Harrisburg Chapter as teachers; membership in the Guild; and an opportunity to play in a chapter program. The deadline for applying for this scholarship is April 30.

While previous piano experience is desirable, it is not required. The ability to read music is crucial, so having some experience with singing or playing another instrument is required.

Since 2001, this fund has given 165 awards. Many students who were scholarship recipients in the past have continued study and are now serving churches, are studying music in college, or are otherwise engaged in playing the organ.
