Approximately 125 people enjoyed the evening concert. A birthday cake and reception followed the concert.

Rhonda Sider Edgington wrote: "As summer officially comes to a close, I'm finally finding a minute to sit down and post a highlight - the gathering in July in Ontario to celebrate my dad's 90th birthday. I addition to fun by Lake Erie with many friends and relatives, there was a family concert, to celebrate our mutual love of music, and the many years of music making that have gone into his 90 years."

"When he was just a teenager, on lunch break from a summer job, my dad walked into a church in downtown Dunnville, and heard the organ playing for the first time. When the organist there asked if he'd like to take organ lessons, the course of his life (and then mine) was changed."
