

POE Interview-Part III

I interviewed another POE student and I thought that I was busy! Zachery Ford is from Newport, Pa. He is the son of Mary and Jim Ford and is a Junior in High School. He told me that most of his endeavors are musical in nature. He is the pianist at his school for the senior high and junior high and fifth and sixth grade choruses. At the high school he is the accompanist and participates in the show choir which is named *Innovations*. The school does a yearly musical and this year they did *The Wizard of Oz*. Zachery played the piano for this and also was an understudy for the Tin Man.

His high school has a marching and concert band and he plays the mallets: xylophone and marimba along with percussion line. He also plays for the jazz band. He has participated in choir and band honor festivals. In Jr. High he participated at the state and regional level choral festivals.

Millerstown has a community band named the Greenwood Community Band and he plays for that. He is currently studying piano with Mr. Galen Deibler. Music seems to be an all consuming passion for him.

Zachery told me that he does have some other interests as well. He is part of PYEA which is a Pennsylvania youth service organization. He is President of that. He works on the school yearbook and is also a columnist for his school newspaper. Next year he will be the editor of that paper.

His college plans are not firm yet but he thinks he wants to go into Music Education and Piano Accompaniment. He is in the National Honor Society and also "Tri-M" which is an honorary society for students in music. He seemed very excited and happy about his experience with POE and told me he hadn't had experience with the organ until last summer. He wants you to know that he has an organist position at Hope Eternal United Methodist Church in Newport. He said he is still working with the "pedal thing." He has had that job for 3 months. I say, "Good job Zachery." We need more young people to go into church music even if it is a part time experience.

Board Meeting Notes

Our Executive Committee met on Tuesday, May 28 at 7:30 at Faith United Church of Christ in New Cumberland. The meeting began with an order of special business appointing Chuck Yocum to fulfill the term on Phyllis Mooney who resigned her term. Kathy Myers presented a complete treasurer's report along with a report of our recent audit. The board approved the reinvestment of funds coming to maturity. The program committee submitted initial plans for next season (see the left column of this page for the details). The guidelines for compensation have been under revision by a subcommittee. Shelly Moorman-Stahlman distributed a preliminary copy for further consideration by the board members. The board decided to sponsor a student for private lessons this summer and to sponsor a student to attend a POE this summer. Funds for these projects will be taken from a recent special gift from Mel Shenk. The registration of membership in our chapter was discussed and Doris Savage was appointed to work on this aspect, relieving Kathy Myers of the task. All membership records will now be managed by Doris. The newsletter editorship was discussed and it was decided to seek a new editor for the next program year. An editorial board was established to oversee the newsletter and prescribe its content. Kathy Myers was appointed chairperson. Job descriptions for our chapter have not been revised since the late 80s, so the board members were given the old copies to begin the process of revision. It was noted that we have not been presenting a formal budget in recent years, so we will strive to develop one before the August meeting for approval. Outgoing board members were recognized: Don Golden, Jane Miller, Doris Savage and Shelly Moorman-Stahlman. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, August 6, 2002 at 7:30 PM at Faith Presbyterian Church, Harrisburg.
