SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

SHENK SCHOLARSHIP

In 2002 Melvin Shenk gave funds in memory of his mother, Violette Shenk. Recognizing the need to train new organists, the Harrisburg Chapter designated the *Shenk Scholarship Fund* towards encouraging qualified young middle and high school students to study the organ and to develop the skills and commitment to serve as church organists. The Guild offers qualified applicants a limited number of scholarship for free instruction in organ playing, the equivalent of ten weeks of half-hour lessons. Harrisburg Chapter members provide the Shenk Scholars with lessons. Each year the Chapter invites these students to participate in a Member and Student Recital. Before his death in 2021 Mel continued financial support for this fund. We encourage others to support this important outreach.

YOCUM SCHOLARSHIP

When Charles M. Yocum, Jr. retired in 2003 from a long and distinguished career as a church musician, his church honored him by establishing the *Yocum Scholarship Fund*. At his death in 2016 many memorial gifts from friends and family were given to the Yocum Scholarship Fund. The Harrisburg Chapter has designated these funds for providing full-tuition scholarships for students aged 13 - 18 to attend AGO Pipe Organ Encounters (POE). A POE is a 4-5 day regional event organized by a local AGO chapter under the sponsorship of the national organization, introducing teenagers to the world of the organ. The purposes of a POE:

- Provide individual and group instruction in the rudiments of organ technique and service playing.
- Give a general overview of organ literature and history.
- Expose the participants to concepts and examples of pipe organ construction and design.
- Offer opportunities to participate in ecumenical worship, so as to experience the role of the sacred musician.
- Provide an invaluable opportunity for young musicians to meet others with similar interests.

THRONE SCHOLARSHIP

In 2011 a gift was given to the Harrisburg Chapter AGO from Mt. Zion Lutheran Church, Churchtown from a bequest of Ida Enck Throne who served that congregation as organist. The money was given to help train organists. The Harrisburg Chapter earmarked this fund to promote adult education.

Purpose of the Throne Fund:

- To provide or help provide assistance for education and / or certification of adult members of the Harrisburg Chapter AGO.
- Training and materials for certification of Harrisburg Chapter AGO through the AGO. This may include but is not limited to:
 - ♦ Paying teachers to help prepare and guide through the process.
 - Paying for registration and materials needed to be certified.
- Providing scholarships to a Pipe Organ Encounter Plus (POE+) for adults.
- Providing registration assistance for Harrisburg Chapter AGO members to attend educational conferences and workshops on organ related topics.

How To Apply

For the Yocum scholarship, basic keyboard proficiency is required, although previous organ study is not necessary. Deadline for application is March 15 each year.

The Shenk Scholarship is open to students entering grade 6 through those completing grade 12 and Yocum Scholarship is open to students age 13-18.

For the Shenk scholarship, students should have an interest in music. Ability to read music is crucial so having some experience with singing and / or playing another instrument is desirable. Deadline for application is April 30 each year.

For both scholarships a short application is required.. For the Shenk scholarship an additional requirement is to provide a recorded audition to be uploaded with the application. Visit harrisburgago.org and click education to find application materials. All young pianists are encouraged to apply!
